# GUEST ARTIST: DEE ROBERTS FEBRUARY 28, 2023 Meeting from 6 to 8 pm at THE MANDARIN GARDEN CLUB, 2892 Loretto Rd, Jacksonville, FL 32223

Dee Roberts is an award winning member of JWS and is the guest artist for the February monthly program. Her program will demonstrate various methods of masking, plus how to control watercolor on Yupo and include a short demo using alcohol ink.

Dee has been painting and drawing since she was five years old. Dee went to the Philadelphia College of Art with a major in Illustration. Her goal as an artist is to catch the spirit of what she sees, in abstract form as well as through naturalistic nature and wildlife paintings. Regardless of the medium, her finished works are stunning. She works flawlessly with pastels, watercolor, collage and acrylic, and has garnered many top awards around Florida and Georgia with each of them. She consistently surprises the viewer with the strength and confidence in her work. With minimal brushstrokes her subjects come to life, seemingly ready to jump off the canvas.

Her work has been displayed in all the major museums and galleries in the Jacksonville area. Dee had a two-person show at the Cummer and has art in the permanent collections of the University of North Florida, St. Johns Country Day School, at AT&T and in the homes of many private collectors.

She has won numerous awards for best painting, best pastel, best figure and best watercolor painting in St Augustine Art Association, Jacksonville Watercolor Society, and Art Guild of Orange Park, as well as other regional shows. In 2010, she was named Jacksonville Watercolor Society Artist of the Year. She has attained signature status in the Florida Watercolor Society and was juried into the National Watercolor Society's 2014 International Watercolor Show.

# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hi, all you wonderful watercolorists!

I've been thinking a lot lately about how to choose a subject for my next watercolor. I'm fairly sure all of you may have this same challenge at some point. I mainly use my own photos to paint from, even if I'm just "fooling around". Who knows if something good may come out of it and I may want to enter it into a show with very specific rules about your reference photos. Often the show standards specify that only a photo that you personally took can be used as a reference- even if you have permission to use someone else's.

So, I keep a file on my computer labelled "Possible Paintings". However, sometimes as I browse through it-nothing inspires me. I have now sat in on enough judge's critiques to know that subject matter is often the absolute most important attribute of a good painting. The viewer needs to be drawn into your painting-using color, composition, and most importantly, subject matter. I've often heard a judge say that those items trump being "technically well done". Another piece of advice I've heard which I think about often is- if you are going to paint something common-think palm fronds, beach scenes, or birds of paradise here in Florida-you better be offering something in the painting that is different. Something to make that very mundane subject matter stand out from the other hundred people painting it-be it point of view or unusual color-some other wow factor.

All easier said than done of course. But just a few things to think about before you start your next masterpiece!


