JWS History and Founding Members:

A brief history of how JWS started in 1982 is provided by Rosemond Parish, one of the founding members. We are grateful to the founding/charter members listed for their time and interest in initiating the Jacksonville Watercolor Society.

Short History By Rosamond Parrish, Founder

In February 1982, with inspiration and counsel from legendary instructor Edgar Whitney, Rosamond Parrish called together a group of 26 watercolor painters at her house for the first meeting of the Jacksonville Watercolor Society. By October 1982, membership had grown to 100, demonstration meetings were held on the 4th Tuesday of the month and the first workshop was held. The first juried exhibition was in June 1983 at the Kent Campus

Gallery of FCCJ (now FSCJ).

March Demonstration: Tuni Weiss

Tuni's Teachings...

Didn't we have fun in April as Artist of the Year Tuni Weiss introduced us to the delights of painting on Yupo with watercolors?

Members experimented with the freedom of the medium at several painting stations which Tuni had set up around the room. At one, heavily pigmented paint was being dashed on with big brushes. At another, artists had their hands in the paint, pressing fingerprints into flower petals. At another, wipeouts occurred without worry.



Library Book Re-review

Janet does not have a new update this month as she is scheduled for another back surgery. To keep us focused on painting I am going to rerun a favorite book review from a year ago.

Anders Zorn Sweden's Master Painter

Often when we think of Anders Zorn we think of him as a master oil painter but in truth he had a virtuosic command of watercolor. Many of the paintings we look at are indeed watercolors. He didn't switch to oils until 1877 so most of the works we know are watercolors. He was a contemporary of Sargent's and the two liked and respected each other's work. If you look at their watercolor work next to each other you will see a rather striking difference. Sargent's works are more expressive and suggestive. Zorn's works are as literal as his oils. They are luminous, but with a meticulous technique. It is really quite stunning.

The book is a full discussion of Zorn. His coming to America where he painted some of his most famous portraits, and then traveling to Spain, London and Paris, where he worked with the Post Impressionist. All of this had a profound effect on his work. However the thing that made the biggest impression on me was his development and use of the Zorn palette, which is a very limited palette to say the least. Using only one white, (he used lead white, not made anymore except in Europe and now requires special order) plus one red, one yellow and one blue/black only he created true colors that had a relation to one another. Now you might think that this is way to limited. I know I did. I prefer "why use one

color when you can use them all"! But with discipline and development of your eye you will be astounded by what can be achieved.

The fun part is picking the red, the yellow and the blue/black. You will get very different results using an alizarin crimson than a Windsor Red. The same would occur with yellow ochre verses lemon yellow and the same for your dark choice. But choosing and making your palette is almost as much fun as using it.

I first became aware of this while oil painting. The creation and understanding of this pallet is work no doubt but once you've done it, like me you'll wish you had done it sooner. Now of course bringing this knowledge to watercolor for me was paramount. The bigger surprise was finding out that this worked for landscapes, still life and frankly wherever you wanted to take it. I found myself no longer seeking a specific color because I had exactly what I needed in front of me. All I had to do was mix it and it was all in harmony with what was already there.

If you are interested in this palette I would suggest that you go out on You Tube and type in Zorn palette. It comes up with the one for oil first, but type in watercolor in and you will see a discussion and demonstration that goes beyond what I can say in this short space.

Choosing to work this palette is only one benefit of studying Zorn's work. His composition, the intelligent organization of his pictorial space and what he was able to communicate will boggle your imagination. His brush work will dazzle you.

I know you'll enjoy this one.
