


Our Tuesday, September 28, 2021 Meeting will be IN REAL LIFE AT THE MANDARIN GARDEN CENTER,

Note: 2021 Dues must be paid by September 30 to enter this show!

ON-LINE SUBMISSION FOR JUDGING: OCTOBER 7-14

The show will be judged on-line by **Chris Flagg**. Chris will make his decisions based on the photos you will submit on our web site **October 7-14**. (The long take-in period allows time for you to ask questions/resolve any problems.)

TAKE-IN/HANGING OCTOBER 25 10A.M.-1 P.M.

Paintings can be dropped off at the Church on **October 25.** We will be hanging the show that afternoon."

The Show will be hung for viewing in the wide hall galleries of the new, beautiful, Christ Episcopal Church building located on San Juan Drive (turn East at Solano Road light—<u>directions</u>) in Ponte Vedra.

SHOW OPENING NOVEMBER 6, 2-4 P.M.-1 P.M.

Our Opening will be held on **November 6**th with minimal refreshments served (COVID 19 still creates limitations).

I suggest that you print these out before you watch the DVD, as it will be more helpful to follow along. Also included is a gallery of her other paintings.

able to add a few lovely new DVDs to our Library, three to be exact. There is something for everybody here and I know you will enjoy them.

Getting Started Right in Watercolor with Jan Kuntz. We are lucky enough to have two other Jan Kuntz' DVD's; Watercolor Portrait Painting and Painting Roses in Crystal. But this one is for beginners or for a refresher if you haven't been painting in awhile. I must say – as I have not been painting in awhile that I enjoyed this DVD. She goes through the basics such as how to set up your workstation; paper choices, tools, and corrective techniques such as lifting and getting rid of balloons. She also uses a ruling pen for drawing. Any of you who have taken a class with Ted Head will know all about ruling pens! This DVD is a perfect starting point for Jan's other DVD's

Animal Portraits in Watermedia with Pat Weaver. I myself have never taken a class with Pat Weaver but now I am jealous of those who have. Pat is a wonderful teacher! She has been painting for years starting in oils and going over to watercolor for the past twenty years. Now the name of this DVD, Animal Portraits, is actually a little misleading. True it's all about animals but if you're a portrait painter or want to be it's about getting a true likeness and painting in a painterly manner as well.

Pat uses a limited palette specific to each subject and she demonstrates on five different surfaces: Arches 140, Yupo, and clay board among them. I love her drawing lessons! She draws from dot to dot. Any of you who have taken a workshop with Charles Reid or watched one of our DVD's of Mr. Reid will recognize this immediately. She also uses very little water in her paint mixing as it helps her control the flow of paint. Pat is very conscious of shapes relationships and balance in all things including warm/dark, cool/warm and the thickness/thinness of paint.

Be sure to check out Pat's other DVD, Watercolor Simplified.

Glowing Watercolors with Brenda Swenson

Oh, you are going to love this one! Whether or not you are fans of painting negative spaces or not you will learn a new way to see color, shapes and how they mingle and bounce off each other to create new colors and new shapes to help you see a world you might have missed.

Now Brenda goes into a long discussion on color and how to read what is actually in the tube and she goes through her own color bible. Now I was tempted to skip this part but I stayed with it and learned an incredible amount. As with any artist she discusses her tools, papers and yes her colors and why she uses those particular ones.

Then on to her demonstration – actually two – and she just blows you away! You are going to want to watch this several times in an effort to see what she sees as she swipes and spins her brushes around shapes pulling out strong designs and compositions. She makes glazing a natural easy thing, which is a tool that you will be able to take to your own paintings no matter what you choose to paint how you want to paint it.

This one will be rented many many times!!! I guarantee it!

Well there you have it! A good mix even if I say so myself. I'll be at the back door with all three of them plus all our others. If you borrowed DVD's don't forget to return them as others will want to borrow them and cash flow is how we are able to buy new ones! See you soon.....

Xi Guo, member of the Jacksonville Watercolor Society and Signature member of AWS (American Watercolor society), NWS (National Watercolor Society), and NWWS (Northwest Watercolor Society), was born and grew up in Shanghai, China. She earned her BFA in oil painting from Shanghai Normal University. We are fortunate to have her as a member and an instructor!

After she completed her graduate school at Savannah College of Art and Design (SCAD), where she majored in photography, in 2014 Xi moved to St. Augustine, Florida. Xi started to focus on painting with watercolor about eight years ago and became an international award-winning artist. Her articles and paintings have been featured in the International Artist Magazine, the Art of Watercolor Magazine and Watercolor Artists Magazine. Her paintings were included in the art-book, The Best of Watercolor- Splash 16 and Splash 20, published by North Light Books.
