#### 2024 SPRING SHOW

## The Spring Show will be early again this year, so get your paintings ready to submit online starting January 22nd.

Paintings will be on exhibit from February 2 through February 25, 2024 at St. Augustine Art Association (SAAA), South Gallery, 22 Marine St., St Augustine, 32084. Open Tues-Sun 12 to 4 pm.

This venue is available through the generous donation of long time JWS member, Virginia Meadows. JWS Awards will be announced at a reception/awards ceremony during the First Friday Art Walk on February 2 at 7 pm. For more information about the First Friday Art Walk, parking, free shuttle, see <u>Art Galleries of St Augustine</u> (AGoSA) brochure.

Note: SAAA charges a commission for artwork sold through SAAA - 30% for STAAA members and 50% for non-members. STAAA membership is \$60 annually. Price your artwork accordingly. There is a size limitation for this show - no longer than 28" on the longest side of the frame and no less than 12" on the shortest side. Please see the separate article on changes to Show Standards regarding acceptable frames (page 6).

Online entries will be accepted from January 22, 2024 through midnight January 28, 2024. Please see <u>online entry instructions</u> on the website, If you would like help with entering online, please contact Barbara Holt at 904-874-4916.

Delivery/Take-in of framed and matted paintings to "remote" drop-off locations must be completed by January 29, 2024, where artwork will be inspected and delivered on January 30 from 11:00 am to 1 pm at St Augustine Art Association. Use of remote drop-off locations is encouraged due to the limited time frame on January 30th. #### 2024 GENERAL MEETINGS—NEW LOCATION DIRECTIONS

Starting January 30, 2024 our general monthly meetings will be in a new location-Cypress Village, 4600 Middleton Park Cir E, Jacksonville, FL 32224 in the Osprey Room (in main building near entrance).

**Directions:** From JTB East toward Beaches, exit at San Pablo Rd S and go north for about half a mile. (please adjust if coming from another direction) Pass Mayo Clinic, turn left at the light onto WM Davis Parkway. Continue **1.5 miles** to the entrance of Cypress Village. Special Event signs will be posted directing us to the main parking lot. Enter through the main entrance and stop at the concierge desk for directions to thed Osprey Room.

#### **IMPORTANT 2024 CHANGES IN JWS SHOW STANDARDS**

#### Effective January 1, 2024, JWS Show Standards will accept wood frames in addition to metal frames.

Please read the specifications carefully to make sure your framing is in compliance. We hate to turn away any painting because it is framed incorrectly.

If you have any questions about acceptable framing, please contact Barbara Holt before take-in at 904-874-4916.

**FRAMING** – Metal frames in **gold**, **silver**, **black**, **or white** will be accepted with no embellishments. Wood frames with a professional finish appearance of black, white, or natural and wood tones will be accepted. Wood frames must be **plain flat** framing with no embellishments or ornamentation. Frames may be up to 2" in width. Hardware for wooden frames should be D-strap hangers. Wire shall be securely fastened to conventional flat holders. No screw eye or saw tooth hangers. Acrylic plastic (plexiglass) is required on all entries. No glass. Work not suitably or safely mounted is unacceptable.

<u>MATS</u> - Mats, if used, must be white or off-white, single or double mats only. No colored filets allowed or floating on color. Simplicity of presentation allows each work to be viewed on its own merit and on an equal basis with the other submissions.

**<u>FRAME DIMENSIONS</u>** – Shall be no more than 44 inches (unless otherwise specified for the particular show) and no less than 12 inches in either direction.

#### SHARING TIPS

#### Having trouble getting started on your painting.

I recently saw a YouTube video that might be helpful—by <u>Oliver Pyle "The best-ever</u> <u>watercolor exercise?"</u> - This has a short watercolor workout that allows you to practice the following technical skills: color mixing, brushstrokes, wet-on-dry, wet-on-wet, timing, and managing a wash. It is a good warm up before tackling the other elements for a successful painting and to help your progression as a watercolorist. It reinforces what many workshop instructors have told us. Try it and let me know what you think!
