Monthly meetings are held in the Auditorium—Room 101 in Building “G” at the FCCJ South Campus on Beach Blvd.

Two (three to five day) workshops are conducted by celebrated instructors in the Spring and Fall of each year.

Two annual exhibitions are sponsored by JWS and open to members in good standing.
