Janet Killackey writes our book reviews.

We the People Mary Whyte

If you're like me – I consider Mary Whyte one of today's greatest living watercolor painters. It's not just her unsurpassed artistry but it is also her ability to get the very essence of the people she's painting onto her paper. Far more than just a likeness. Having taken two workshops with her, I am always surprised by her generosity of spirit and her willingness to share her craft.

Her last work was a collection of paintings called "Working South." It was a testament to those working in all-but-forgotten blue-collar jobs disappearing in the Southern United States. It was nothing less than stunning.

In "We the People" she has surpassed herself. The prose with which she describes her thought processes, failures, discarded paintings, starting again and getting past the uncertainties and dead ends is a must read for all of us who have ever doubted our own way. It is as important as the paintings. This set of paintings took her seven years. The ability she has to see another's inner soul burst from the paintings and dares us to look away unaffected by what we have seen.

This book is about patriotism. It's about the men and women who defend this country without expectation of recognition. People with quiet resolve, doing their duty as they see it, then trying to return to the life they left – a life that has gone on without them, many going back to the Second WW. I have to say my favorite is Archangel. I'm sure you'll have a different one but the simplicity of this one is striking. Mary paints these people as and who they are and not what we want them be.

She opens this collection with a quote from Ronald Reagan. "Freedom is never more than one generation away from extinction. We didn't pass it to our children in the bloodstream. It must be fought for, protected, and handed on for them to do the same, or one day we will spend our sunset years telling our children and our children's children what it was once like in the United States where men were free." Seems a fitting way of closing this book review.
