

Conference/Event Participation Standards

The **Consortia of Administrators of Native American Rehabilitation (CANAR)** is a national member organization committed to providing a productive and welcoming environment for our conference and meeting participants as we come to support and advocate for the national TVR program. All participants, including attendees, speakers, volunteers, exhibitors, staff, and service providers are respectfully asked to follow CANAR policy related to the planning of other events held in conjunction with CANAR conferences.

All attendees are also expected to register and pay the appropriate registration fees unless otherwise waived by the CANAR. If you are not shown as a registered participant with a name tag, you will be asked to register and pay the appropriate registration fee prior to attending conference sessions or events.

Cultural Respect and Sensitivity

CANAR conferences and events are to be safe places for TVR Program staff, Native Americans with disabilities, and their advocates. We value the voice of all participants to learn and share knowledge. Honoring the diverse cultures, traditions, and history of each tribe is our top priority. Any disrespectful, harmful language will not be tolerated. Failure to comply with such restrictions may result in an attendee's removal from the venue, without a right of readmission, reimbursement or other compensation.

Unauthorized Solicitation and Distribution of Materials

Solicitation of business from CANAR members during all conference events is strictly prohibited without the prior approval of CANAR. Distribution of flyers, pamphlets, notices and brochures during any conference session is also prohibited without the prior consent of CANAR. Also, any materials distributed at a CANAR conference must be available in alternate formats prior to distribution. Individuals or organizations who violate this policy may be asked to leave the conference, without a right of readmission, reimbursement or other compensation.

Speaker/Exhibitor Endorsements

The ideas, opinions, products, and/or services displayed by exhibitors at CANAR conferences are solely those of the presenters/exhibitors and do not necessarily reflect the position, policy, opinion, or endorsement of CANAR as a national organization.

Video and Photo Consent and Usage

CANAR may conduct video recording and still photography at meetings, conferences, and events for future use including educational, promotional, and marketing activities of the Council. Your participation in a CANAR event constitutes your consent to be photographed and video and audio recorded for use by the CANAR as described above. CANAR also reserves the right to restrict audio and video recording at CANAR conferences and events based on a speaker or performer's cultural preference and/or contractual agreement with CANAR. Attendees agree to adhere to any restrictions relating to the recording of conference events.
