
### **Christmas Hampers**

Windsor offering us winter coats for veterans from the Windsor Veterans Memorial Services Committee. We were able to distribute coats to housed, sheltered and unsheltered veterans. In addition, we were able to give to children of veterans in need as well. Their arms reached across the province and we stand beside you in giving to those who have given so much to us.



#### Cambridge Neighbourhood Table

It has been a privilege to work beside Kinbridge Community Centre in providing meals to our community twice a month from the Freedom Centre. We walk along side Generations Cambridge(formerly Preston–Cambridge Church in providing this ministry. This last year we served 992 meals. There were 112 Children served, and 247 seniors. We started with 9 in attendance at our first meal with over 100 at our largest meal. This practical service allows us not only to feed those with food insecurity, but to also offer a place for relationship building.







#### Sandwich in the Park

Sandwich in the park continues to serve our community of Ward 3 each Monday night (except holidays) at the Cenotaph Park in Cambridge. Our volunteers brave heat, rain, sleet and snow and without exception, serve sandwiches, coffee, fruit, desserts and frozen meals to our guests. As we continue this ministry it has become an opportunity to serve friends who we know by name and enter into their stories, struggles



and grief. We have people dependent on this event in order to eat during the month.
