The Sexton's Cottage, also known as a tool house, was constructed around 1922. The Greene family is cited as contributing to the construction of the structure. The wood-framed stucco-covered building was designed in the Classical Revival style and features a front gabled roof and unadorned pediment. A hood over the door also features a Greek key design and is supported by scrolled brackets. Curving cast stone balustrades extend from its north and south sides.¹

For over 50 years, the Sexton's cottage was the only tool house on the property, until the addition for a larger green structure near the southwest corner of the cemetery in the 1980's.
