### Health Care Committee

The Health Care Committee has high hopes for happy holidays and we wish you all joy. Hopes for Health Care Reform in 2025 are harder to muster.

Reform should be easier now. The December 4th murder of a corporate health insurance executive on a street in New York has touched off an explosion of rage and has added people from all over the country to our activist-choir.

A colleague's letter to the editor in the December 18thSan Francisco Chronicle outlines the problem succinctly. He claims that the assassin:

- aimed at the wrong target;
- · used the wrong weapon; and
- · wasn't the right person to do the job.

But will we be able to connect the dots? How many Davids can we recruit to fight our Goliath? Will the upsurge of people who clearly know something is very wrong realize that it's not just the CEO, but the whole profit-first business model for healthcare we live with in the U.S. that has blood on its hands? As my colleague's letter went on to explain, the weapon "must be legislation to replace private health insurance with universal health insurance through a **fair**, **publicly financed program.**"

That's where our local health care committee comes in. The reform movement we are a part of *has* a well-documented solution in hand. We have done the research, developed the policies, written the legislation, shown the cost savings, and more. We just need to abolish the multi-billion-dollar private forprofit health insurance industry and establish SinglePayer/Improved Medicare for All.

Won't you resolve to join us in the New Year?!
