

My Background

I graduated from Boerne High School in 2021 and was a 3-year varsity player under Coach Kimble McHone. My junior year I was 11th in the nation in 3-point shots made, and second in Texas in 3's made with 133; shooting 41% from 3. I scored 446 points my junior year and helped lead my team to the Regional Tournament. I was honored to win District MVP and won Offensive MVP for my team. My senior year was during the heat of covid, and we were lucky to play as many games as we did. I ended the year winning District MVP and Team MVP. I was 7th in the nation in 3's made and first in Texas in 3's made with 119. I shot 47% from 3 my senior year, earning a lot of awards along the way. I led the team in scoring with 474 points, averaging 15.3 points per game. My senior year we made it all the way to the state semi-finals where we sadly fell short of the state finals. I was honored to receive All-State, All-Region, and All-Area Super Team. I was selected to play in the Chicken Express All-Star game where I also won the 3-point contest they held. In addition, I was selected to play in the State All-Star game. At Boerne High School I have the record for most 3's in a game with nine. I hold the record for most 3's in a season with 133, and I hold the record for most 3's in a career with 261. Throughout my career I had a total of 960 points.

Through my senior year I was heavily recruited by a bunch of schools to play ball at their school. I finally made the decision to commit to Nebraska Wesleyan University. After graduation I worked my tail off every single day, I lifted and shot and worked on my game, so I was fully ready to head up to Lincoln in the fall. As soon as I was moved in, I went straight to the gym and got to work. Shooting, ball handling, lifting – EVERYTHING -making friends with my teammates and building chemistry with them. I was first to conditioning every morning, first to team lifts, first to open gym and last to leave every day. I was the first one to practice every single day, I stayed after every single day, I eat, slept, and breathed basketball! I was such a hard worker just looking for my opportunity to go out and do what I love. After a year at NWU, I decided to come back home. I still play basketball every chance I get. Basketball is a major part of my life, and it always will be. I currently attend Northwest Vista College, where I am studying Kinesiology and playing Intra-murals. I love training younger kids in the art of basketball. And I love helping young people grow in every facet of the game.
