The Shelby County Bluebird Club is one of 7 local chapters of the Tennessee Bluebird Society, which is an affiliate of the North American Bluebird Society (NABS) (<https://www.nabluebirdsociety.org/>).

The Shelby County Bluebird Club was originally established by two Shelby county residents who were dedicated to restoring the bluebird population. Through their efforts of cavity nesting bird conservation and developing public awareness, the Club became an "official" chapter of the Tennessee Bluebird Society some years ago. Although the membership was small, the efforts of the members and trail monitors were large. In 2016-2017, the Club had 8 trails that were being monitored. As of summer 2023, we were monitoring over 30 trails with 200 bluebird nest boxes. Although the original founders are no longer able to be active in our Club's activities, new leadership is carrying the message forward and recruiting additional members.

Just like the Tennessee Bluebird Society, our Club encourages and aids in the development of nest box trails and the collection of data for research. We would love to have you join us.
