- Fundraising Goal: \$100,000


2022-2023 Budget Report

Budget Report

- Income so far: \$159,392
 - Fall Fundraiser: \$134,214
 - Equity Fund: \$11,775
 - Annual Fund: \$122,439
 - 2022 Spring Fundraiser: \$6,732 rollover
 - Other Fundraisers: \$15,436
 - PTA Dues and Fees: \$3,010
- Goal for Spring Fundraiser: \$100,000
- Estimated expenses of \$297,130 for the year, with a deficit of \$37,738
- Starting Balance: \$312,795
- Ending Balance: \$275,057

2022-2023 Staffing Grant

- \$189,000 from PTA and \$20,000 from school funds pay for:
 - 0.5 Art Teacher
 - 0.5 Academic Interventionist
 - 0.3 Office Staff
- The grant enables:
 - Math classes for those in split grade classrooms
 - Specialists providing intervention
 - Serving all students in the art studio



Math – Art Collaboration

- Envision Curriculum contains Pick A Project
- 2nd graders have worked with Ms. Lundgren and Ms. Stump to do art and math projects
- "We have prioritized bringing joy and passion to ignite student learning."
- Projects are on display in 2nd floor hallway

2023-2024 Budget Planning

SPS Budget Deficit

- \$131 Million deficit for 2023 2024 school year
- Strategies to address the deficit
 - Rainy day fund
 - Central office reductions
 - School reductions
 - Consolidating schools
 - To obtain a system of well-resourced schools
 - Start in 2024-2025 school year

2023 Montlake Elementary Allocations


- Projected Enrollment of 174 (177 projected in 2022, actual 184)
- Same allocations as last year:
 - 8 Classroom teachers
 - 1.5 PCP: 1 PE, 0.5 Art
 - 1.0 Admin, 0.5 Admin Assistant, 0.5 Library
 - 0.5 Counselor
- Different allocations than last year:
 - 1.5 SpEd, 3.0 IAs
 - 1.0 Access teacher and 3.0 Access IAs
 - 0.5 Resource teacher and 0 IAs (last year: 0.8 Resource teacher of 1.0 IAs)
 - No health coordinator
 - Per pupil funds are slightly lower

Proposed 2023-2024 PTA Staffing Grant

- PTA Staffing Grant of \$205,000 and funds from school
- Would pay for
 - 0.5 Art Teacher
 - 0.5 Academic Interventionist
 - 0.3 Office Staff

Proposed 2023-2024 PTA Expenses

First pass at budget:\$291,500 in expenses



2023 – 2024 PTA Budget Estimates

- Estimated Starting Balance: \$275,057
- Very Conservative Estimated Revenue: \$195,000
- Estimated Expenses: \$291,500
- Deficit: -\$96,500
- Estimated Reserves: \$178,557
- Required Reserves: \$145,250
