A) CALL TO ORDER

The Council for the City of Norwood met in regular session on the above date with Mrs. Donna Laake presiding. The meeting opened with a prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

On roll call, the following members answered present: Mr. Clark, Mr. Thompson, Mrs. Hanrahan, and Mr. Sanker; Mr. Bonsall, Ms. Stevenson, and Mr. Breadon were absent.

E) AMENDMENT OF AGENDA

There were no amendments to the agenda.

F) MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

There were no minutes from previous meetings.

G) PRESENTATION OF LIFE SAVING AWARD TO OFFICER HOFFMAN AND OFFICER SCHIDELER

Chief Kramer explained the Life Saving Award; it is presented to an officer who is responsible for saving or prolonging life through life-saving efforts, rendered first-aid techniques to aid in the preservation of human life, and their actions led to the prolonging of life to the extent the victim was released to the care of medical authorities. Chief Kramer spoke of events that took place on January 11th; both officers responded to an unresponsive non-breather and began performing chest compressions until medics arrived and took over. The individual did pass away at UC Medical Center, but taking this action allowed the family to say goodbye to their loved one. Chief Kramer presented the Life Saving Award to Officer Hoffman and Officer Schideler; both officers received a standing ovation by all in Council Chambers.

Mr. Sanker thanked both officers for their service and he also acknowledged the fine training they received; Norwood officers are prepared to react in these types of situations.

Mrs. Laake also thanked the officers for initiating chest compressions; taking this step means the world to these families.

Mr. Sanker thanked all who were in attendance and he also thanked the American Legion for coordinating this event. Mrs. Laake commented on the two new flower pots at Victory park; one recognizes POW/MIA which has black and white flowers, and the other recognizes the Purple Heart and contains purple flowers. Mr. Thompson commented on the appreciation that was expressed toward the recognized usage of the park.

Mr. Sanker reminded everyone that school is out and the pool is open. There is more activity on the sidewalks, and he encourages residents to be cautious and aware when driving.

On a motion by Mr. Sanker, seconded by Mr. Thompson, it was moved to receive and file the letter and to move forward, provided there is \$260,000 for the match.

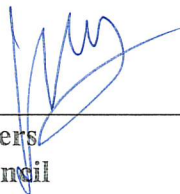
All members present voted, "Yes."
