MAYOR'S TERMINATION OF THE STATE OF EMERGENCY DECLARED MARCH 16, 2020

Pursuant to my duties as chief conservator of peace within the City of Norwood, Ohio under Ohio Revised Code §733.03, I hereby terminate the State of Emergency within the City of Norwood, Ohio, which I declared on March 16, 2020, effective immediately. Based upon the Norwood City Health Department's written reports of COVID-19 Statistics within the City of Norwood over the last several weeks and months, after 1,619 confirmed cases in Norwood, including 10 confirmed fatalities, the rate of infection of COVID-19 among residents of the City of Norwood has declined and remains relatively stable, in the low single-digits over the past few weeks, and 7,633 doses of COVID-19 vaccine have been administered by the Norwood City Health Department as of June 1, 2021, to a broad spectrum of adults in Norwood, first to emergency first responders serving the City, then to middle-aged to older residents of the City of Norwood, then to other adults. Additional doses of vaccine have been administered at the Hamilton County Board of Elections in Norwood, and at retail pharmacy facilities within the City of Norwood.

I further note that effective June 2, 2021, the Director of the Ohio Department of Health has rescinded seven Orders about COVID-19 issued between March 15, 2020 and May 4, 2021. Any lawful Orders issued by the Governor of Ohio, by any Ohio department, and by any political subdivision other than the City of Norwood, are not impacted by my termination of the State of Emergency which I declared within the City of Norwood on March 16, 2020.
