




Yard cleanup, spring planting and church decorating Party

LEVs are licensed by the bishop to serve for 3 years. Those interested in serving as Lay Eucharistic Visitors must be invited to serve in this capacity by their clergy or person charged with pastoral oversight in the congregation. Once invited to serve, they must attend this 2-hour virtual training, complete Safe Church requirements and undergo a background check. 
