A WORD FROM OUR RECTOR: EXCITING NEWS!

Hello Saints!

I hope that you are enjoying the Easter season so far. I wanted to tell you about some exciting news! As you know, I have been working with St. Paul's in Jeffersonville by presiding and preaching on the first Sunday evening of the month at 5pm. That has been lovely and if you were able to join us on Maundy Thursday, you know how great it was to worship together. That is exciting, but that is not all!

I want to tell you that the diocesan staff, St. Paul's Jeffersonville, and St. Paul's New Albany have been working hard to explore ways that we can do more in our community. As a result, by the grace of God and approval of Bishop Jennifer Baskerville-Burrows, we will be getting a Curate for a full-year!! A Curate is a newly ordained priest who works with a mentor after ordination to experience the inner workings of a parish more closely. They can do everything that a Rector or priest can do, when it comes to preaching, pastoral care, serving at the Eucharist, and offering absolution/blessings. This is usually a one-to-two-year call as an opportunity for the new priest to "cure" before taking a more permanent call.

We will be hosting the ordination of The Rev. Dr. Cory Michael Irwin on June 15th at 11am. See below for more information about him and mark your calendars now because you don't want to miss this joyous occasion. It will indeed be a great day for the Church!

Cory Michael will be starting at St. Paul's on June 17th! His office will be on the second floor of the Parish House but don't worry, he will meet you downstairs if the staircase is a problem. I hope that you are as excited as I am to welcome Cory Michael to St. Paul's!!!





FROM THE ORGAN BENCH

So....just what is the purpose of the music before, after, and during the Liturgy? Have even you thought about it? Have you noticed how coordinated it is with the Scriptures and seasons of the Church? Is it just background noise for you? I am adding another hat to my collection: in addition to organist and director of choirs, I will don the hat of music educator. Most weeks, I will write this column pointing out interesting things to listen for in the music with the hope of making what we do up front more meaningful and inspirational for you as you come to worship every Sunday. That is the complete purpose of the music in Liturgy. Not entertainment and certainly not Muzak, to use an old expression.

This Sunday and for about another month, we are still in the celebratory season of Easter. The hymns will continue to reflect the joy of the Resurrection. This week's Prelude is "I Know that My Redeemer Liveth" from Handel's Messiah, arranged from the aria to an organ solo.

Sunday's choir anthem is "Take this Bread" by Jim Stanton, retired Deacon at St. Paul's Jeffersonville, who is a wonderful composer of church choral music. I met Jim during my previous time here when he was attending this St. Paul's. One day, he very quietly left one of his choral pieces on the organ and said to look if over, no expectation to actually use it. It was brilliant! Since then, I have collected his music, published and unpublished, and even organized a choral reading session for several area churches about 10 years ago to introduce his music to them. It was well received. Sunday's anthem is beautiful with great meaning for the reception of Communion. One of our favorites!





The Episcopal Diocese of Indianapolis and Other Offerings:

Spiritual Care Visitor Training April 20

Spiritual Care Visitor Training is a 12-month program that equips lay persons with active listening skills and other tools that will help them assist in pastoral care in the parish or in an outreach setting such as a nursing home.

The training, offered by the Bishop Anderson House of Chicago, and sponsored by Diocese of Indianapolis and the IN-KY ELCA, begins with a retreat for participants on April 20 at Church of The Nativity, Indianapolis. **Participants in the training must be approved by their parish clergy**. Once approved, click **here** to complete a short application for the training.

Application deadline is April 14. Participants will also need a background check and to complete several Safe Church modules. Participants are supervised by their parish clergy or a member of the agency where they are volunteering. Cost of the training, including the retreat is \$75. For more
