## Central Nebraska Senior Golf Association 2021 Scholarship Report

For the year of 2021, our Central Nebraska Senior Golf Association was able to give five \$1000 scholarships. Our association had five boys and eight girls apply from across our region receiving the five scholarships. Each applicant received outstanding letters of support and were involved in activities in their school and community; plus, all of the applicants' GPA was 3.8 or higher. As in the past, this was another unbelievable field of gifted athletes representing our youth from across our region. Here are our five recipients:

Baylee Steele of the North Platte High School.

Baylee is the daughter of Scott and Melissa Steele. Bailey currently ranks 4<sup>th</sup> on the ALL-TIME scoring list of the CNSGA Scholarship winners since 2005. Miss Steele finished in the TOP 3 in Class A district competition and in the TOP 6 in the Class A state tournament all four years of her high school golf career. VERY IMPRESSIVE! In invitational meets, this Bulldog won 13 meets and finished in the TOP 10 24-times during her high school career. This decorated four-time state medal winner led her 2020 North Platte Bulldog Girls' Golf Team to a NSAA Class A Team State Championship and a NSAA Class A State Girls' Golf Tournament Team Runner-up finish in 2018 and 2019. Miss Steele actively volunteers in her community, church and served in many high school organizations while maintaining a 4.0 GPA. Baylee is currently ranked 1st in a class of 312 students. She was selected to the NSAP Super Academic All-State Team and GNAC All-Academic Team. Baylee Steele plans on attending the University of Nebraska at Omaha in her pursuit of a business degree while competing for the Maverick Women's Golf Team.

As Gothenburg's Most Valuable Player and as a FIRST team member of the Southwest All-Conference, Jake led his Swede Golf Team to several Top 5 finishes during his high school career. This Swede maintained a 3.9 GPA during his high school career. He received Academic All-State honors and was a National Honors Society member. In FFA, he was a 2-time state champion in Parliamentary Procedure and a Chapter Officer. Jake plans on attending the Northeast Community College at Norfolk while playing for the Northeast Hawks Golf Team and majoring in Business Administration with plans on transferring to UNL to major in Professional Golf Management.

She finished first in the NSAA District III three times during her high school career!

Her competition at invitational meets was IMPRESSIVE. She placed first 16 times and placed in the TOP 10 27-times all during her high school career! This Cardinal due to her fine achievements was selected to the Super State Golf team in 2019 and 2020. During her high school career, Abbigail maintained a 4.0 GPA. She was on the Academic All-State girls' golf team all four years of her high school career. She actively volunteers in her church and served in many high school organizations including band where she was drum major all four years of her high school career.
