## REVEREND HEN KHAN GO FOUNDER OF GHMC

Rev. Hen Khan Go comes from a small village called Saipimual in Myanmar. His parents were born again Christians and served in ministry together. His father, Evan Zam Za Dal, became a Christian in 1945 and was the only one among his brothers and sisters that was a Christian. God called him to be an evangelist in the Baptist circle, composed of 12 churches from 1970-1990. He also served the Lord as an Evange- list for 35 years. He always told his family when "Kairo's time" comes Burma will become a Christian Nation."

As he walked through the planning dynamics, Rev. Khual Do, father-inlaw, was convinced. Rev. Do studied at the very first Mission Bible School in Tedim (1947-1950). He graduated under the mentorship of Rev. F. O. Nelson and achieved a Diploma in Bible School, then they worked together with Rev. Khual Do. He would say, "in the near future you will have mission center for Christ." Rev. Go's heart began burning for the lost souls in 1976 and he spent time in Keltal Village where he first began to share his faith with three other families. God called him into ministry in 1991, where he went to study the word of God in India for four years. His fulltime pastoral minis- try began on May 1, 1995. He served as pastor at LCBC, where his father served in the past 35 years. While being a pastor, he saw a 747airplane flying above his fami- ly and prophesied, "One day our family will ride on a 747 airplane and preach the Gospel of Christ, from nation to nations, country to country, all around the world." Those words came true, and he flew to Manila, Philippines, in 1998. After studying three years, God gave him a Vision for a Mission Center for Christ while studying for his Masters in Leader- ship at Manila and started GHMC in 2005.



Do Lal comes from a small village in Myanmar where he grew up in a Christian family with a family line of pastors. At a young age, his father pointed to an airplane and told him that he was going to go into all the world and preach the gospel. In 2008, God brought him to America where he met his beautiful wife Kim. They were soon marriage and had four children. While their family in America, Do had an open vision from heaven of Myanmar and the blueprints of how to change the nations, starting with Southeast Asia and spreading to the ends of the earth. After this encounter, he had the same dream every night for two weeks straight of thousands of people weeping and screaming as they were going to hell. He would wake up from the dream in the middle of the night. He felt a sense of urgency to do something about this dream and during the first week, he questioned and blamed the Church thinking, "Where are the pastors and evangelists? Why are they not helping?" It was during the second week of having the dream, he realized, "Why not me? What can I do to help and make a difference to change people's eternities?"

After praying about the dream, the call from God was to GO as a laborer in the mission field. Do quit his job and returned to Myanmar. It was there that he started to hold crusades, preached, built up the churches, and helped train the next generation to become leaders and to make disciples. After three years God called his family to join YWAM Kona to further expand the Kingdom with community. The YWAM leaders asked him to join their ministry to make a larger impact. Do and his family have lived in Kona since 2018 and have been able to send seven mission teams each year to Myanmar. They have distributed over 55,000 Burmese Bibles and hosted five crusades. Thirteen different Christian ministries have joined together with one purpose to impact the seven spheres of society and transform the nation of Myanmar.
