A MESSAGE FROM ROB GILLETTE, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD

On behalf of the Baldwin Society Board of Trustees, and the Gillette Family, I'm pleased to present the 2022 Baldwin Society Supporting Older Adults Annual Report.

2022 was the first full year of operations for our newly named philanthropic called Baldwin Society Supporting Older Adults.

We focused on several key goals this year including:

- · Increasing our social network of followers
- · Launching our Senior Advisory Council, comprised of seniors who live at Baldwin House Senior Living
- · Expanding community partnerships
- · Identifying partners to partners to help us achieve of goal of eliminating financial elder abuse

I'm pleased to report that we had a great year! Our Dignity and Hope fund raiser cleared more than \$75,000, after expenses. This was possible thanks to the generosity of volunteers, including our treasurer Karon Bohlender, and the engagement of my family, including my wife Kari and my older daughter, Lauren.

My younger daughter, Katie, who was away at school most of the year, also got in on the action too helping to deliver 57 holiday hope care packages to shut-in seniors to help remind them that they are not alone.

Another highlight was the merger with the Legacy Medical Foundation. This merger allowed us to become part of the return home safe initiative, with Henry Ford and Detroit Habitat for Humanity, which aims to create a safer home environment and home care services to help prevent avoidable readmissions. The program served 55 elders in 2022, providing home modifications and in -home care services. The project goal is to serve another 55 by May 2023.



We also welcomed two new Board of Trustees this year, Steve Ebben (former Legacy Medical Foundation Executive Director); and AK Vijay (Director of Operations, The Orchards Michigan).




A FEW GRANT RECIPENT STORIES
