

What does it take to start a charter school you ask?

Well, let us tell you!

Lots and lots of hard work, many volunteer hours, and a community that supports us in so many ways.

We have been able to do so much already because of our dedicated Board of Trustees and large circle of supporters and volunteers. So many individuals have given their time, energy, and expertise to our cause that we have been able to accomplish a staggering list of tasks with a very small budget. The 200+ page application and appendices to the NH State Board, the months and months of property tours and real estate research, the newsletters, website creation, social media and word of mouth



outreach, the country-wide hunt for faculty and staff, the Board recruiting, business connections and City of Keene communications; all of these things were done through dedication and basically for free.

But good wishes and lended hands can only get us so far. The time has come that we need to raise a substantial amount for startup costs that can only be covered by money in the bank.

But this is a free school you say!

Yes, it is absolutely a free school, open to all NH residents, and we are dedicated to it being available to as many students as we can enroll given the size of our facilities, the scope of our faculty, and the approval of the State Board of Education. But in order to bring this education to our enrolled students, furnish our classrooms, pay our faculty starting in July, lease our facilities, and hopefully expand our program over time, we need to bridge the gap between now and when State funds are sent to us in mid-September.



Yup, you heard that right, we won't be getting any of our State funding until at least two to three weeks *after* school starts. And that federal start-up money that we are so excited about? The State has accepted the funds from the Federal government, but let's face it, they don't work at nearly the speed that we do, and it may be weeks if not months before we find out how we can even use those funds, much less receive

the actual funds.

In order to meet our pre-operational goal we need to raise \$300,000. It's a big number, but we are not daunted and we know that with everyone's participation and creative thinking, we can get there!

So what can you do, you ask?

community and help spread the word. A gift in any amount supports Gathering Waters in our pre-operational phase, raising the funds needed to prepare the school for the children joining us this fall. Pre-operational costs include administrative work, building renovations, and faculty salaries. In coming together as a community, we can realize the vision of Gathering Waters as a tuition-free elementary- middle- and high school, accessible to all, guided by the principles of public Waldorf education.
