Lets Green Your Routine

Build a Certified Wildlife Habitat

As a resident of Edgewood, we are fortunate to have lots of green space to support our local wildlife. Did you know that you can become a certified Community Wildlife Habitat by developing a certified habitat on your property?

What is a habitat?

Habitats can be a place for birds, mammals, reptiles, or insects. They can be small or large--

as big as a whole backyard or as small as a container garden. For all habitats, there are four essential requirements: food, water, cover, and a place for wildlife to raise their young. Specifically, to qualify for certification, each habitat must have:

- 3 food sources
- 1 water source
- 2 cover and 2 nesting spaces
- At least 1 Sustainable Practice from 2 out of the 3 categories
