Jump into June!

Dear Neighbors,

As the days grow longer and the temperatures get warmer, summer is upon us. June 1st is the beginning of hurricane season and it is not too early to prepare. NOAA's Climate Prediction Center has issued its outlook for the 2022 Atlantic season. It's predicting above-average hurricane activity this year; which would make it the seventh consecutive above-average hurricane season. They are forecasting a likely range of 14 to 21 named storms (winds of 39 mph or higher), of



which 6 to 10 could become hurricanes (winds of 74 mph or higher), including 3 to 6 major hurricanes (category 3, 4 or 5; with winds of 111 mph or higher). Dr. Missy Williams, Ph.D. the founder of the Dania Beach Vervet Project will be our speaker for the evening. Dr. Williams is a scientist with a passion for animal welfare and conservation. She received her Ph.D. from Florida Atlantic University in Integrative Biology. She founded the Dania Beach Vervet Project while completing her dissertation when she realized that the monkeys were lacking welfare and conservation efforts. She believes that animals are individuals that express emotional and cognitive complexities, and are not dispensable objects. Missy prioritizes animal welfare in decision-making as she considers it a moral duty to foster co-existence between humans and nature. In addition to Dr. Missy Williams, we will be having an officer from FLPD as well as our code enforcement officer in attendance.

As stormwater construction continues there are many detours, please be mindful of speeding! School will be ending for summer break so please be careful with children playing outside as well as our animals.

Lets Green Your Routine



Residential Bulk Waste Collection

The Bulk Trash Pickup Program features collection of large household items and tree trimmings, up to 10 cubic yards in size, for residential customers. Items accepted for bulk trash pickup include: appliances, furniture, carpet, mattresses, and toys. Please do not place tires in bulk piles.

Schedules and Routes

Bulk trash is collected once per month. **Edgewood's** pick-up is the **1st Thursday** of the month. If you cannot wait for your collection day, you may schedule an appointment for pick-up. There is a fee for this service.

Set Out Instructions

Please place all items at least four feet away from any waste carts, mailboxes, trees, and/or power lines. Avoid blocking storm drains; lay items in such a way as to minimize the likelihood of them blowing over.

Alternatives to Bulk Trash Pick-Up

Often, the items you place in bulk trash can actually be useful to others. Before you throw something away, please investigate whether donating, scrapping, or otherwise disposing of your old items is a possibility. Find out more here.

Yard Waste

Yard waste, such as tree branches and large quantities of leaves in boxes/bags, may also be set out on bulk collection days.
