Neighbors Helping Neighbors

Scotty Packard (pictured) has clear memories of his 97 years. From being 3 years old in 1927 in the house that his father built in Toledo, Ohio to his move to Florida in 1960. The smiling, white-haired, concert pianist is a great grandfather who remembers much of nearly a century of history.

He has seen the world face tragedies, like every war since 1924, and he anticipates the challenges of

recovery from Covid-19. "It won't be at one time, it will be gradual," Scotty said of the pandemic, "This is global, it's in every country, no matter how big or small."

Sitting socially distant in a lawn chair during an interview in his front yard in Edgewood, in March, he explained that he wanted to be part of the healing. That's when neighbors across the street, Shelly Bradshaw and Jim Hammond, jumped in to help.

"Scotty is connected on Facebook and was seeing so many get the vaccine," Jim said. "He called us and asked, "How do you do this?"



"Shelly turned this into a mission, she helped about 10 people get the vaccine within a month," Jim said.

For Scotty's first shot, the trio masked up and drove to downtown Miami at 7 am on a Saturday morning. "I thought it would be a short drive, I almost said, "Turn around". Scotty had not been to Miami in 12 years and was shocked by the growth. "I would have driven to Atlanta to get him the vaccine," Jim said.

Grateful to his samaritan friends, Scotty has always been a helper himself. He worked as a civil servant in the Fort Lauderdale area for decades. He handled records for dog inoculations for Broward County, then spent 25 years with the U.S. Postal Service. "I started as a clerk, then as a timekeeper at Southside Station in 1974 at Seminole Annex at I-95 and Broward," he said. He then worked at the original post office, a beautiful marble building downtown where he handled registered and certified mail. "And I kept moving up," Scotty said.

Even after he retired, he went back to work as a volunteer at the Broward County Library for 27 years. His specialty was non-fiction, using the Dewey Decimal system. "The books have to be in the exact spot. I had to concentrate," Scotty said. "I think that kept Alzheimer's away."

Now grateful to have the vaccine, he looks forward to seeing his family. He was married in 1944, has a daughter and two grandchildren, and 4 great-grand. He recently talked with his granddaughter who is planning a visit.

"If this vaccine affects everyone, it will be so less worrisome," Scotty said and added that he may visit family up north. Scotty's words of advice for people considering the Covid-19 vaccine? "It's a matter of life and death, it's your life and other people's health."
