

The Bee School consists of six Saturday morning classes (3 hours each) either in person at the LCC or online and then live hive dives in White Mountain Apiary & Bee Farm's colonies. This enables the students to not only get a good head start on what they need to do in order to become a good beekeeper but to conquer any fears they may have.

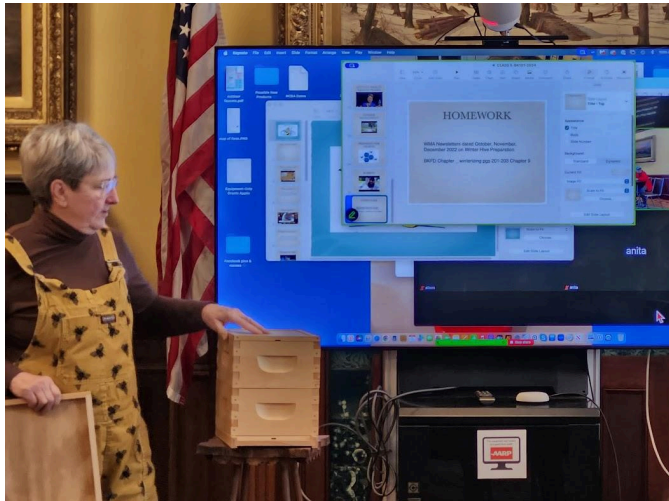
These classes are offered in person and online via zoom at the time of the class. The recordings are available for those students who would like to enrich their beekeeping education, but at their own pace. They are also available on private youtube links for the students to refer back to. The bonus is that students can repeat the class for free yearly after taking it the first season. Beekeeping is always evolving and this keeps beekeepers up to date with the most scientific findings. There is a fee for the class that helps support the work of the association.

The North Country Beekeepers Association meets the 2nd Sunday evening of each month at the Bethlehem Library. They normally try to have speakers at the regular monthly meetings. The general public is invited to those meetings.
