### Welcome Center

1. *Carson City, NV, 2014, Robert Lisak*, archival pigment ink print, 28" x 22", edition 1/20. Nevada achieved statehood on October 31, 1864. Its capitol building was built in 1871; the architect was Joseph Gosling.
2. *Hartford, CT (Leg), 2020, Robert Lisak*, archival pigment ink print, 42.5" x 31", edition 1/10. Connecticut achieved statehood on January 9, 1788. Its capitol building was built 1872 - 1878; the architects were Richard M. Upjohn and James G. Batterson.

1. *Honolulu, HI (exterior), 2015, Robert Lisak*, archival pigment ink print, 31" x 42.5", edition 1/10. Hawaii achieved statehood on August 21, 1959. Its capitol building was built November 10, 1965 - March 15, 1969; architects were Belt, Lemmon & Lo and John Carl Warnecke & Associates.
2. *Richmond, VA (interior), 2015, David Ottenstein*, archival pigment ink print, 20" x 19", edition 1/20. Virginia achieved statehood on June 25, 1788. Its capitol building was built 1785 - 1788; the architects were Thomas Jefferson and Charles-Louis Clérisseau.
3. *Saint Paul, MN (exterior), 2017, David Ottenstein*, archival pigment ink print, 22" x 28", edition 1/20. Minnesota achieved statehood on May 11, 1858. Its capitol building was built in 1905 and the architect was Cass Gilbert.
4. *Indianapolis, IN, 2013, David Ottenstein*, archival pigment ink print, 25" x 19", edition 1/20. Indiana achieved statehood on December 11, 1816. Its capitol building was built 1878 - 1888; the architects were Edwin May and Adolph Scherrer.
5. *Columbus, OH, 2015, David Ottenstein*, archival pigment ink print, 22" x 28", edition 1/20. Ohio achieved statehood on March 1, 1803. Its capitol building was built 1839 - 1861; the architects were Nathan Kelley and Isaiah Rogers.

### Spear Classroom – Lidgerwood Education Building

1. **Oklahoma City, OK, 2014, Robert Lisak**, archival pigment ink print, 28” x 17.5”, edition 1/20. Oklahoma achieved statehood on November 16, 1907. Its capitol building was built in 1917; the architect was Solomon Andrew Layton.
2. **Richmond, VA (exterior), 2015, David Ottenstein**, archival pigment ink print, 31” x 37”, edition 1/10. Virginia achieved statehood on June 25, 1788. Its capitol building was built 1785 - 1788; the architects were Thomas Jefferson and Charles-Louis Clérissseau.
3. **Hartford, CT (Lincoln), 2020, Robert Lisak**, archival pigment ink print, 63” x 31”, edition 1/10. Connecticut achieved statehood on January 9, 1788. Its capitol building was built 1872 - 1878; the architects were Richard M. Upjohn and James G. Batterson.
4. **Topeka, KS, 2014, Robert Lisak**, archival pigment ink print, 22” x 28”, edition 1/20. Kansas achieved statehood on January 29, 1861. Its capitol building was built 1866 - 1907; the architect was E. Townsend Mix.
5. **Honolulu, HI (interior), 2015, Robert Lisak**, archival pigment ink print, 22” x 28”, edition 1/20. Hawaii achieved statehood on August 21, 1959. Its capitol building was built November 10, 1965 - March 15, 1969; the architects were Belt, Lemmon & Lo and John Carl Warnecke & Associates.
6. **Little Rock, AR, 2016, Robert Lisak**, archival pigment ink print, 42.5” x 31”, edition 1/10. Arkansas achieved statehood on June 15, 1836. Its capitol building was built November 27, 1900 - January 1, 1915; the architect was George R. Mann.
7. **Saint Paul, MN, 2017, David Ottenstein**, archival pigment ink print, 28” x 22”, edition 1/20. Minnesota achieved statehood on May 11, 1858. Its capitol building was built in 1905; the architect was Cass Gilbert.
8. **Trenton, NJ, 2017, David Ottenstein**, archival pigment ink print, 22” x 28”, edition 1/20. New Jersey achieved statehood on December 18, 1787. Its capitol building was built 1792 - 1911; the architects were Jonathan Doane (1792), John Notman (1845), Samuel Sloan (1871), and Lewis Broome (1889).
9. **Des Moines, IA, 2014, David Ottenstein**, archival pigment ink print, 31” x 42.5”, edition 1/10. Iowa achieved statehood on December 28, 1846. Its capitol building was built 1871 - 1886; the architects were Alfred H. Piquenard and John C. Cochrane.

### Whitman Tavern – Lidgerwood Education Building

1. **Juneau, AK, 2016, Robert Lisak**, archival pigment ink print, 31” x 37”, edition 1/10. Alaska achieved statehood on January 3, 1959. Its capitol building was built September 18, 1929 - February 21, 1931; the architect was James Wetmore.
2. **Lansing, MI, 2014, Robert Lisak**, archival pigment ink print, 37” x 31”, edition 1/10. Michigan achieved statehood on January 26, 1937. Its capitol building was built 1873 - 1878; the architect was Elijah E. Myers.
3. **Albany, NY, 2014, Robert Lisak**, archival pigment ink print, 20” x 19”, edition 1/20. New York achieved statehood on July 26, 1788. Its capitol building was built 1867 - 1899; the architects were Thomas Fuller, Leopold Eidlitz, Henry Hobson Richardson, and Isaac G. Perry.
4. **Boston, MA, 2014, Robert Lisak**, archival pigment ink print, 25” x 19”, edition 1/20. Massachusetts achieved statehood on February 6, 1788. Its capitol building was built 1795 - 1798; the architects were Charles Bulfinch, Charles Brigham Sturgis, and Bryant, Chapman & Andrews.
5. **Madison, WI, 2015, David Ottenstein**, archival pigment ink print, 42.5” x 31”, edition 1/10. Wisconsin achieved statehood on May 29, 1848. Its capitol building was built 1906 - 1917; the architect was George B. Post.
6. **Montgomery, AL, 2014, David Ottenstein**, archival pigment ink print, 42.5” x 31”, edition 1/10. Alabama achieved statehood on December 14, 1819. Its capitol building was built 1850 - 1851; the architects were Barachias Holt, Frank Lockwood, in consultation with Charles Follen McKim of McKim, Mead & White.
7. **Salt Lake City, UT, 2018, David Ottenstein**, archival pigment ink print, 42.5” x 31”, edition 1/10. Utah achieved statehood on January 4, 1896. Its capitol building was built December 26, 1912 - October 9, 1916; the architect was Richard K. A. Kletting.
8. **Cheyenne, WY, 2013, David Ottenstein**, archival pigment ink print, 31” x 37”, edition 1/10. Wyoming achieved statehood on July 10, 1890. Its capitol building was built 1886 - 1890; the architects were David W. Gibbs and William DuBois.
