PSALM 15



God is everywhere at once, all-present. He's in your bedroom, at your school, in your church, at work with Dad or Mom, and across the world ... all at the same time. Isn't that amazing! Yet, though God is all-present, the Bible says that God has a home, where He lives. It is called "heaven," a perfect place where God and His kids live forever. The question is, "How do we get to heaven, to God's home, when we die?" A verse you have already memorized tells us how:

REVIEW

John 3:16 – "For this is how God loved the world: He gave His one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life."

What do we have to do to live forever with God? We have to This means we don't trust in ourselves to have our sins forgiven and to be saved, we trust in God. Which brings us to another question: What are those who believe in

God like? How do they live? What do they say? What do they do?



Psalm 15 helps us to know what a believer in God is like, how someone who lives with God forever lives.

REVIEW

Psalm 15:1 – “Who may worship in Your sanctuary, LORD? Who may enter Your presence on Your holy hill?”

Several thousand years ago, God’s people worshiped God at a temple, kind of like a church. The above verse calls this temple a “sanctuary,” meaning a “holy place.” The temple was at the top of a hill, seen by everyone. And inside that temple, in a room towards the back (called “The Most Holy Place”), was a special piece of furniture called the Ark of the Covenant, a special box covered in gold containing some special things. This temple was God’s house. This Most Holy Place was God’s room. And the Ark was where God was said to be. King David, who wrote Psalm 15, is asking in verse 1, “Who gets to go into God’s house?” In the rest of this psalm, David answers this very important question.



MEMORIZE

Psalm 15:2 – “Those who lead blameless lives and do what is right, speaking the truth from sincere hearts.”

“Blameless” people are not perfect people. Remember, no one is perfect but God. But blameless people are “good” people, people who – when others think about them – think that this person desires to please God. God’s people are blameless!

They do what is right, even when doing the right thing is hard to do.

Can you think of a time when you did the right thing, but it was hard to do, for some reason?

Not only are God’s kids blameless (“good” people). Not only do they do the right thing, even when doing the right thing is hard to do. But they tell the truth! Why is telling the truth sometimes hard to do?

MEMORIZE

Psalm 15:3 – “Those who refuse to gossip or harm their neighbours or speak evil of their friends.”

Have you ever said bad things about your friends to other people? That’s called gossip. And even if what you said is true,



it hurts your relationship with your friends, and doesn’t please God. God’s kids don’t gossip! They use their tongues, their words, to encourage others, to help them and not hurt them.

1 Thessalonians 5:11 – “So encourage each other and build each other up, just as you are already doing.”
