PSALM 15 (2.0)



In Worksheet #43, we started to learn Psalm 15, a psalm (like a poem/song) that talks about what God's kids are like. First, we learned how to be one of God's kids: by trusting Him for our salvation. After this, God makes us more and more like His Son, like Jesus. Like Jesus, God's children do the right thing, they tell the truth, they don't gossip about others, etc., just like Psalm 15 talks about.

MEMORIZE

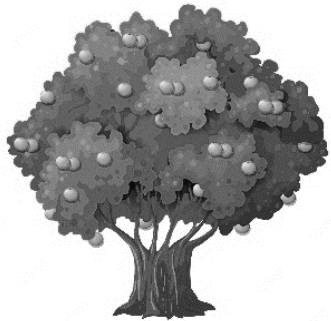
Psalm 15:4 – "Those who despise flagrant sinners, and honour the faithful followers of the LORD, and keep their promises even when it hurts."

God loves the world, including those that hate Him and disobey Him. Isn't that amazing! And God wants His children to love everyone, just as He does. But, as this psalm says, His kids are to "despise (hate) flagrant (really bad) sinners." Now, this doesn't mean that we hate people that hate and disobey God, but that we hate the way that they live, and we don't let them lead us down the same bad path that they are on.

On top of this, members of God's family honour (they look up to and outwardly respect) faithful followers of the LORD." This might remind you of Psalm 1, a psalm you already memorized. Fill in the blanks in Psalm 1 below. Here are the words to choose from: **worthless, trees, mockers, wicked, godly, delight, destruction, sinners, prosper**

Who we spend time with, and who we look up to matters. Make sure you look up to godly people! Godly people keep their promises, just like God keeps His promises. Be a promise-keeper!

MEMORIZE

Psalm 15:5 – "Those who lend money without charging interest, and who cannot be bribed to lie about the innocent. Such people will stand firm forever."

Nowadays, if people want to borrow money, they often go to a bank. And if the bank lends them money, it will charge them interest, meaning that they have to pay back what they borrowed plus a little bit (sometimes a lot) more. When Psalm 15 was written, thousands of years ago, banks didn't exist. If you needed money back then, you would go to a family member, or a member of your community, and ask them to lend you money. And if they did, God told them not to charge interest. He did this to help people, and to keep others from taking advantage of one another. God's kids help one another!

They are also fair! They can't be bribed. To be bribed is to be given something (money, things, a favour, etc.), causing you to make a decision that isn't right or truthful or fair. God's kids are always honest, just like their Father in heaven is.



If this psalm describes you, you will "stand firm forever." This verse in another Bible version says, "He who does these things will never be shaken!" Do you want to be unshakeable? Then you need to put your trust in

God for your salvation, and choose to live your life God's way, like the Bible tells us to live.
