Last time you read *The Picture Bible*, you read up to page 299.

You read how...

- ...God helped His people, Israel, take the Promised Land.
- ...God’s people forgot about who God is and what He did for them.
- ...during the time of the Judges, a non-Jew named Ruth chose to follow God. She became the great-grandmother of King David.
- ...Israel wanted a king, even though God was their king. Saul became Israel’s first king. He started well, but finished...

Read pages 300-314

- David waited for about 15 years to become Israel’s king. Though he had opportunities to take the crown from Saul, he patiently trusted God and waited for His good and perfect timing. David was a man after (i.e. He did things God’s way).

Read pages 315-329

- After 7 years, David finally becomes king of all Israel, and is chosen as the capital city of the kingdom.

Read pages 330-347

- David makes a big mistake. He desires another man’s wife, a woman named and has her husband, Uriah, killed in battle. Thankfully, David asks God to forgive him, but the consequences of his sin do not disappear: (1) the death of his baby son and (2) trouble in his family, seen through a very sad time with one of his older sons,

Read pages 348-367

- Absalom is defeated, and the kingdom remains in David’s hands. David chooses his son, to be Israel’s next king. Once again, problems occur in David’s family, as David’s oldest son, Adonijah declares himself to be king. Thankfully, this didn’t stop God from making sure that the crown was given to David and Bathsheba’s son. Then, at the age of 70, David breathes his last breath. Though David made many mistakes, he walked closely with God, seeking God’s forgiveness when he sinned. Truly, David was Israel’s greatest king.

Read pages 368-382

- When Solomon ruled, Israel was wealthy and at peace. But, over time, Solomon forgot that God provided everything for him and his country, and the king began to worship the idols that his many wives worshiped. Because of this, God divided the kingdom and gave part of it to one of Solomon’s officials, a man named
