## Spring Bulbs

Tips for planting Spring Bulbs...

- Formal Bed – Combine early bulbs such as hyacinths and tulips with icicle pansy's for early spring color.
- Naturalizing – find an area that isn't mowed too early such as underneath trees, a hillside or near a woods. Toss the bulbs into the air and plant as scattered, avoid planting in rows.
- For Three Seasons of Color:
  - Early Bloom – Snow Drop / Crocus / Hyacinths
  - Mid Bloom – Daffodils / Early Tulips
  - Late Bloom – Dutch Iris / Allium / Late Tulips
- Trouble with squirrels or other critters? Cover bulbs with chicken wire, then soil



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## Lawn Care

Fall is a great time to repair damage by re-seeding or starting a new lawn.

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## Showy Shrubs

Native shrubs have leaves and berries combine for great color. Use for borders, privacy sdf

- Itea - Henry's Garnet has brilliant burgundy fall color
- Beauty Berry – blue berries
- Whip cord arborvitae
- Boxwood
- Rhododendron / Azalea



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## Autumn Interest

Plant Perennials for color now and next year.

- Plant dramatic grasses in areas where you want attention, add fall mums for color.
- Enhance the beauty of Hydrangea's fall color by a mass planting of Autumn joy sedum. Their rosy red colors will complement each other.
- Blend textures – Autumn joy sedum connects with coneflowers and the soft tones of euphorbia's texture hold everything together.
- Use plants that always look good – grass, sedum, aster,
