ALPA Executive Vice Presidents – ALPA National Representation

Your Airline's Voice at ALPA National

ALPA's executive vice presidents (EVPs) represent their respective pilot groups on the Executive Council and serve two-year terms. When the AA pilots rejoin ALPA, they will be afforded an EVP position due to the size of, and dues income provided by, the AA pilot group. These positions ensure representation of every pilot group on a routine basis at ALPA National regardless of which pilots are elected to be the National Officers.

Overview of Executive Vice President Position

ALPA's executive vice presidents represent their pilot groups at the <u>Executive Council</u> level and serve two-year terms. During ALPA's biennial <u>Board of Directors</u> meeting, Group A, B, and C election groups hold caucuses to choose their EVPs.

- Elected at the <u>ALPA BOD</u> meeting to 2-year terms
- Represent their group of airlines at the Executive Council

Group A Carriers – Each Carrier Elects One EVP

Group A carriers are all pilot groups consisting of more than 4,000 pilots or with more than \$10 million in annual dues income provided to ALPA. These are the current group A carriers:

- Alaska Airlines
- Delta Air Lines
- FedEx Express
- JetBlue Airways
- United
- American Airlines' pilot group meet the criteria to be a group A carrier

Group B Carriers – Currently Three EVPs Distributed Among Remaining US Carriers

Group B carriers are all pilot groups that do not meet the criteria of group A carriers.

- Divided into subgroups
- Subgroups are redistricted prior to the <u>BOD</u> meeting to ensure fair and equitable representation
- Member airlines of each subgroup elect their own EVP
- There are currently three Group B EVPs
- The most recent <u>ALPA National Officer Elections</u> voted for Group B representatives from Frontier, Hawaiian, and Endeavor

Group C Carriers – The Canadian EVP

Canadian airlines currently have a single EVP position at ALPA.

- Single EVP position represents all Canadian airlines on the <u>Executive Council</u>
- The group C EVP also serves as the president of the Canada Board
