Answer Key

Today is Palm Sunday. We recall Jesus' entering Jerusalem on a donkey as the people waved palm branches.

Readings	Book	Answer to Question

You may have picked up a palm on the way into Mass though some parishes distribute them at the end.

There is usually a Gospel reading at the beginning of Mass before the procession.

The next liturgical season is the Triduum. We recall the Last Supper on Holy Thursday and Jesus' death on Good Friday. And then Holy Saturday with the Easter Vigil.

Jesus is referring to Judas as the one who would betray Him. Judas betrayed Jesus with a kiss at the Mount of Olives.

The arguments were about who would betray Jesus and who was the greatest and the least. Jesus told them the one who serves is the greatest, we are to serve as He did.
