2nd Sunday of Easter

John 20:19-31

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter, when Jesus appeared to His disciples after His Resurrection. John's Gospel describes how Jesus' followers were huddled in fear behind locked doors. They had good reason to be afraid because the men who had just put Jesus to death sought to stamp out what they considered a band of rebels! It is sometimes hard to imagine what life was like at this time on earth. Unless you were a Roman citizen, you had no rights. Many were slaves, and anyone could be put to death at the whim of the Roman leadership. Yet Jesus says "Peace be with you" three times to His disciples!

Today, He says it to us as well. You may not be hiding in the Upper Room like the disciples were, but you too are called to live in peace. Do things like homework and extracurricular activities and chores keep you very busy? If so, an excellent way to be at peace is to spend some time praying every day. It doesn't have to be very long at all, but talking with God is very important!



Activities:


- Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet as a family! If you've never prayed it before, visit <u>TheDivineMercy.org</u> for more information.
