





Diocesan Assessment

The assessment is used to cover the cost of Diocesan operations and schools. The formula is based on <u>all</u> gross receipts. For our 2023 fiscal year, the annual Cathedraticum Assessment is \$81,472. This equates to a weekly payment of \$1,567. This represents an annual decrease of \$3,600.00 from the prior year.

AST AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. Catholics over the age of 14 years are required to abstain from meat every Friday during Lent. All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are required by Church law to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meal is permitted to persons in this age group on this day, plus two lighter meals.

REFLECTION FROM FR. RALPH

A fairly common question that many if us may have is: How can I best be like Jesus? During the past few weeks, the Sunday Readings provided a hint for us. On the First Sunday of Lent, we are presented with Our Lord's temptation by the devil in the wilderness. The Second Sunday of Lent, we read that Jesus is Transfigured before Peter, James, and John on what is traditionally known to be Mount Tabor. On the Third Sunday of Lent, we learn about Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman at the well, and finally, on the Fourth Sunday of Lent, the Gospel provides us with the account in which Jesus heals the man born blind.

Now, we know that Jesus became like us in all things but sin, and we know too, that Jesus subjected Himself willingly to the Human Condition, and since He did so willingly according to the will of the Father, He did so with great, great love. Jesus entered into our state in life, so to speak, in the most intimate and fullest possible way to bring about in Himself the salvation of every soul that has come into the world. Yet, while Jesus did indeed walk among us to provide us with a most excellent example of how we are to respond to God's will through acts of charity for the sake of the poor and the sick, He also did so to provide us with, through the incarnation in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the very means through which we can actually become like Him. Jesus, who existed with the Father and Holy Spirit from before all ages, united Himself in His divinity with human flesh, becoming man and born into the world, so that all that He said and did to accomplish the will of the Father might become a reality not only in human history, but for us, and ultimately, within us.

So, thus far, as we have heard from the Gospels, Jesus subjected Himself to temptation; He revealed His glory and what awaits us at the Resurrection of the Dead; He teaches us that we must spend time with Him and listen to Him so that we may come to realize who He is; and finally, we learn that only Jesus can provide us with the light of grace so that we may see what He desires to reveal to us.

This weekend, Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead, and we can be confident that, if we subject ourselves to what we have considered thus far, Jesus will not leave us to ourselves in death. Though we are called to respond to the will of God and practice what Jesus reveals to us throughout our lifetime, we strive, in a special way, to practice that to which we are called even now during our observance of Lent. We will be tempted, and Jesus will, if we call upon Him in our worship at Mass and through prayer, continue to show Himself to us just as He really is; He will always make Himself available to us even in our most basic needs to live and in the midst of our daily duties; He will always be the source of grace to us through the sacraments of the Church, enlightening our minds and souls; and He will, through His power, raise us up to a new life of faith, not only for the sake of the life to come, but in this time, during our observance of Lent, so that we may be prepared for the Joy of Easter Sunday.


