REFLECTION FROM FR. RALPH

This Sunday, Palm Sunday, marks the beginning of the Holy Week, the most solemn observance of the Catholic Church throughout the Liturgical Year. We begin this solemn observance to prepare for what is known as the Triduum, consisting of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, with Holy Saturday being the vigil for Easter Sunday.

On Holy Thursday, only two Masses are allowed in the Catholic Church throughout the world. The first is the Chrism Mass, which involves a Mass with blessing of the Holy Oils that will be used for the year until the next Triduum, oils that can be blessed only by a Bishop, as well as attendance of every priest in the Diocese who publicly vow to renew and affirm their fidelity to the Bishop and their priestly office. The second Mass allowed that day is the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper, which consists of the establishment of the ministerial priesthood and the eucharist.

Now, since Jesus celebrated the Passover Meal with the apostles and washed their feet teaching the apostles that as His priests they are to serve others, even in the most humble and lowly way, we too will celebrate Mass, as well as wash the feet of twelve parishioners from our community here at St. Thomas Church. Following the Holy Saturday Mass, the hosts for communion, which are consecrated for Good Friday, are placed in reserve and the Blessed Sacrament is exposed until midnight. As a footnote, millions of Catholics visit the local parishes in their area to pray before the Blessed Sacrament, usually visiting "seven churches" before midnight.

On Good Friday, we will of course receive communion, but only after we read from the Gospel of John the Passion of the Lord. Interestingly, what we observe on Good Friday is the only day of the year that the Church does not celebrate Mass. Rather, a type of communion service is performed as the Liturgy of the Presanctified, involving the distribution of communion of what is already made holy (the consecrated hosts), and it's the only time of the year in which the people of the parish actually read from the Gospel along with the priest. At this liturgy, we will venerate the Cross. It is strongly encouraged that none of this takes place until 3 pm or "the ninth hour," as St. John tells us, the time when Jesus died on the cross. This is when we can publicly show proper recognition and devotion to the sacrifice that Jesus offered of Himself, as Himself, in our place, for our sins, and that of the whole world.

This sacrifice is the last and only sacrifice acceptable to the Father atoning for the sins of all for all ages, and it is necessarily inclusive of penance and repentance. That is to say, the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross fulfilled what was necessary for atonement for our sins, while at the same time, we are to offer ourselves to God as well, in and through the sacrifice offered in and through Jesus Christ. Since we are baptized, we enter into death, a death to sin, vices, and our former way of life, as St. Paul tells us, and we are therefore to offer our struggles and trials in regard to temptation and sin, as well as any other trial or suffering that comes with life so that we can rise with Jesus to a new life at the end of the ages in the glory of the resurrection.

Finally, before Easter Sunday, is the Mass of the Easter Vigil which takes place Saturday evening. This is the most involved and beautiful liturgy of all that the Church observes throughout the year. It can begin only after the sun goes down, a fire is ignited and blessed, the fire is then transferred to the Pascal Candle, there is a procession into the Church, candles held by the congregation receive the flame from the Pascal Candle, the Exultet is sung, readings from the Old Testament demonstrating the history of salvation are read, the candles held by the congregation are relighted, once again from the Pascal Candle, the lights in the Church are turned on as we sing the Gloria, bells are rung, the Gospel of the resurrection is read, Holy Water is blessed, the Pascal Candle is blessed, Catechumens who are becoming Catholic are baptized and confirmed (though rare, a wedding can be performed as well), and finally, we receive newly consecrated hosts of Our Lord's body and blood, Jesus Christ Himself who is the light of the world!

At this point, all of the elements for the parish to provide the sacraments are present in the Church in full, anew, together, for the first time after three days. Note that during the three days of the Triduum, Sunday baptisms, confirmations, funerals, or weddings are not allowed. The only sacraments that are allowed are anointing of the sick, baptism and communion to those in danger of death, and of course, confession. At this point, what will follow are the Masses for Easter Sunday, then the octave of Easter, followed by Divine Mercy Sunday, as well as what is known as the "Easter Season." So, it does not follow that it all ends on Easter Sunday!

So, we are at the beginning of a most sacred time in which we make our way through the history and culmination of our redemption, and we do this with faith, devotion, together as a people, with Jesus Christ Himself leading us ever forward as we make our way with Him as our guide. We encourage that, if and whenever possible, you join us for these most solemn observances. We have made our journey of faith during this Lent up to this point and time and may we all be blessed for whatever we observed thus far, and may we be able to participate as fully as possible in the most holy Triduum to the best of our ability. Surely, God has blessed us with a beautiful way of life and worship as Catholics, and He will continue to bless us and enrich our discipleship in Jesus Christ and our relationship with Him as a loving God the Father.

The blessing of the Easter foods is a tradition dear to the hearts of every Polish family. Being deeply religious, they are grateful to God for all His gifts of both nature and grace. As a token of this gratitude, they have the food of their table sanctified with the hope that spring, the season of the Resurrection, will also be blessed by God's goodness and mercy.

Baskets containing a sampling of Easter foods are brought to church to be blessed on Holy Saturday. The basket is traditionally lined with a white linen or lace napkin and decorated with sprigs of boxwood (**bukszan**), the typical Easter evergreen.
