

REFLECTION FROM FR. RALPH

The judgement of God, the end of the world, the significance of sin, the salvation of souls and the love of God are the more well-known truths of revelation; and in the first reading for this weekend, we are presented with the very controversial situation regarding Sodom and Gomorrah, which involves God's judgement and the destruction of evil, as well as what type of behavior provides justification for said response on the part of God Himself. As a footnote, recall that by this time in Salvation History, we are already presented with a similar situation regarding the Great Flood in the days of Noah.

Now, the exact location of Sodom and Gomorrah are unknown, but most scripture scholars and Church Fathers seem to agree that they were somewhere in the region of the Dead Sea. Also, Sodom and Gomorrah actually represent a territory consisting of five cities known as "Pentapolis," which was most likely made up of five towns clustered together in a similar area. Consequently, there is uncertainty regarding the geographical accuracy of the account in the Bible as we know it.

One controversy regarding why Sodom and Gomorrah were destroyed involves a common misperception of what was actually going on in the region at the time, specifically regarding moral conduct. Many people perceive homosexual conduct as the primary, or even worse, the exclusive cause for the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah, but this is not true. Remember that we are dealing with a time period thousands of years ago, and if we can infer anything from human behavior in recent history, we can't even begin to imagine the behavior of the broken human condition three, four, or five thousand years ago. There is no doubt that human sacrifice, a variety of sexual practices, cannibalism, the drinking of human blood, and many other depravities and grave injustices were common in the ancient world.

Another erroneous interpretation of what led to the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah draws from a reference to a quote in the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel: "*Now look at the guilt of your sister Sodom: she and her daughters were proud, sated with food, complacent in prosperity. They did not give any help to the poor and needy. Instead, they became arrogant and committed abominations before me; then, as you have seen, I removed them* (Ez 16:49-50)." The idea in this case is that Sodom and Gomorrah were destroyed because of a lack of charity towards the less fortunate. This too, is false. Recall that what we see developing in the Prophetic Books is preparation for the coming of the Messiah, Jesus Christ, who would reveal to us the fulfillment of revelation, and this does not involve the abrogation of its past; and not only this, the prophets revealed God's will regarding authentic religious worship, charity towards others and personal morality as the defining qualities of His chosen people.

Consequently, both the lack of charity and sins, both venial and mortal, had everything to do with why Our Lord Jesus Christ, who was totally innocent of any and all sin, gave Himself on the cross for our salvation. To suggest that it was a simple lack of kindness or charity that necessitated His most sorrowful passion and death significantly undermines His great love for us, the sacrifice He made of Himself on the cross, and the serious nature of the mortal sins of the flesh.

Finally, as far as the very form or event that caused the destruction itself, this too, is a debate among scholars. It could've been an earthquake, some type of volcanic phenomenon, and some suggest, perhaps even a meteor shower. In any case, there are more than a few archeological sites in the ancient Middle East that suggest that a once thriving town or city came to know sudden destruction involving the natural, unpredictable powers of nature. However, we must remind ourselves that God worked through the power of nature from the beginning, and that God rendered His promise to Abraham down to the time of Moses and thereafter to establish a people through whom the Messiah would come. So, if God can work wonders for the benefit of His people, then why couldn't God render justice in the same way for a divine cause? In short, if God used the natural elements to manifest His power to the Children of Israel for the good, then what is to prevent God from doing the said same in regards to evil?

What is of the greatest value is what is revealed through the readings for this weekend as a whole. What we can infer is that God gives every opportunity and provision that we may know redemption, and if we believe in what God has revealed to us, what God has accomplished in and through Jesus Christ, and what God offers us even now, we will enjoy the resurrection of the dead and the glory of the Father in and through Jesus Christ. The potential for this depends upon our response, depends upon our willingness to accept the truth of redemption with humble and grateful hearts, our willingness to repent of our former ways, our willingness to allow God to help us, heal us, and forgive us; and yes, it is true, to ask for the forgiveness of our sins with the sure and certain knowledge that God loves us. I leave you with this quote from Our Lord Jesus Christ Himself: "*And this is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me, but that I should raise it on the last day* (Jn 6:39)." *Father Ralph*
