





Diocesan Assessment

The assessment is used to cover the cost of Diocesan operations and schools. The formula is based on *all* gross receipts. For our 2022 fiscal year, the annual Cathedratum Assessment is \$85,072. This equates to a weekly payment of \$1,636. This represents an annual decrease of \$4,633.00 from the prior year.

Annual Collection For the Health and Welfare Fund for the Retired Priests of the Diocese of Bridgeport - November 20-21

This collection is used to offset expenses related to the retired priests that are largely incurred by the Diocese, which include insurance benefits (medical and automobile), Convocation and annual retreat costs. This annual collection is *exclusively* for the retired priests of the Diocese of Bridgeport and should not be confused with the Collection for the "Retirement Fund for Religious," which is scheduled this year for December 19-20.

Our Scout Troop will be selling beautiful double-sided balsam wreaths, decorated with a red velvet bow and pinecones, door sized \$20.



REFLECTION FROM FR. RALPH

There are many reasons that people do not believe what's in the Bible. Now, to narrow things down, and for the sake of our purposes, let's consider the more common reasons that Catholics (actually all Christians) question the validity of what is revealed in scripture, in both the Old and New Testaments:

The Bible is difficult to understand.

The Bible is outdated.

There are many inconsistencies.

I would like to present a very simple example of probably the most glaring reason of all. Some years ago, a certain co-worker would debate with me about what was in the Bible. One day, we were really going at it; over which book, passage, or issue, I can't remember, but it was about Jesus; and I simply asked him when he last read the Gospels for himself. He answered: "I've never really read them." I thought to myself: "He's been debating with me all this time, and he's never read the Gospels?"

This situation is key to understanding the issue at its core. Setting aside the numerous reasons many fellow believers are in conflict with what we believe, some of which are understandable; most people of Catholic/Christian influence that don't believe in what the Bible reveals and disagree with what the Church teaches usually don't read the Bible. Most people, in fact, are familiar with what is in the Bible through what they have heard; what they have read that is not scriptural; that is, commentaries or opinions found in newspapers, magazines, and on the internet; or even a presentation of something from the bible through music, film and popular culture; and finally, many are familiar with what is in the Bible today because of the various controversies of our time. In short, they don't read the Bible for themselves.

Yet, there is another reason that people ascribe to the notions that the Bible is difficult to understand, outdated, and inconsistent. Generally speaking, and often, when we hear the Word of God at Mass, we are hearing the revelation of scripture in a way that is not in the chronological order in which the events took place. I am sure that many of you are aware of this. So, for example, this weekend, we read the Book of the Prophet Daniel first, which is from the Old Testament, then the Letter to the Hebrews; and finally, from the Gospel of Matthew, both of which are found in the New Testament. Historically speaking, the letter to the Hebrews actually developed after the first reading and the Gospel. The experience of scripture in this way can be confusing. Also, the exposure and experience of scripture at Mass is presented using specific portions of a given text, and this is not the same as reading the entire Book of Isaiah, for example. As a footnote however, just as it was from the beginning, when we hear the word of God at Mass, what is supposed to happen is that we hear the word of God, and then we receive the Word of God, Jesus Christ, in the Eucharist. This is obviously essential.

With that said, however, if someone is well acquainted with the Bible, especially through personal reading that is frequent and consistent, and if familiar with the relationship between the Old and New Testaments, what he or she can experience every weekend at Mass is nothing short of wonder and inspiration. Further, reading the Bible is not meant to be like reading anything else. Among many things, the Bible is God's voice and will speaking throughout the ages, culminating in the person of Jesus Christ. So, in essence, reading the Bible is not like reading for the sake of mere information or learning alone. Reading the Bible should be, if assisted with grace and the gift of faith, more like a spiritual exercise that helps us to have confidence in what God has said and done throughout the ages.

With that said however, there is something quite simple and profound available to us hidden within the mystery of Old and New Testament revelation, and the readings for this weekend are a perfect example of this. The Book of Daniel involves the history of the Israelite people during the Babylonian Exile, roughly from 597 b.c., as well as an apocalyptic tradition developing as late as 167-164 b.c. Now consider this quote from this weekend: "*At that time there shall arise Michael, the great prince, guardian of your people; it shall be a time unsurpassed in distress since nations began until that time. At that time your people shall escape, everyone who is found written in the book. Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake; some shall live forever, others shall be an everlasting horror and disgrace.*"

How is it possible that we find such a quote, such a prophecy, that is so accurate regarding the revelation of Jesus Christ, exactly conveying His own words as we know them from the Gospels *before* He entered the world to accomplish the will of the Father? How is it possible that the ancient author of the Book of Daniel could possibly know this? Obviously, this is a clear and certain example (and there are many more) of the prophetic voice, the spirit of God, inspiring the heart and mind of God's chosen vessel, revealing God's will, defying the laws of space and time; defying the laws of physics, above and beyond the intellect and any science of human origin.

Indeed, we can both believe and trust what God has revealed to us, what God has accomplished in and through Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, confident in what is written in the Bible, and we can be confident in what God says to us today. After all, as Jesus says Himself in the Gospel readings for this weekend: "*Amen, I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.*" (Mk 13:30-31)


