

REFLECTION FROM FR. RALPH

The readings for this weekend speak to the beginning and development of the ministry of the Church, and we here at St. Thomas the Apostle parish continue the mission of Jesus Christ in our time today. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Paul, after his conversion, went on to witness in the name of Jesus Christ. In the second reading, we are taught that we must not only speak of the Gospel in Jesus' name, but we must also transmit what we have received through our own fidelity to the truth through works; and finally, Jesus teaches us that He is the source of what is revealed from the Father, and all that we do in His name, if in His name, and according to what He taught us, is truly from Him.

Now, as you know, the twelve apostles received the Great Commission from Jesus Himself in the Gospel of Matthew: "*Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.*" (Mt 28:19-20a) From that moment forward, the Gospel and the Church has grown and spread (like the vine Jesus spoke to in the Gospel for this weekend) throughout the world, and there are currently 1.2 billion Catholics living on every continent.

This Saturday, we will be celebrating a Mass of First Holy Communion for the young disciples here at our parish. The Catholic Church has had the highest possible regard for the blessed sacrament - the eucharist- the body and blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ from the beginning, and we continue this ancient tradition in our time, in our church, in our parish. This is a quote from St. Irenaeus, Bishop of what is now known as Lyon, France, who lived from the years 130-202: "*The slip of a vine planted in the ground bears fruit at the proper time. The grain of wheat falls into the ground and decays only to be raised up again and multiplied by the Spirit of God who sustains all things. The Wisdom of God places these things at the service of man and when they receive God's word they become the eucharist, which is the body and blood of Christ.*" (The Liturgy of the Hours, Vol. II, Easter Season, Third Week of Easter, Thursday, From the treatise Against Heresies by Saint Irenaeus, bishop, Catholic Book Publishing Co., NY, 1976, p. 727-728)

But what we do today is not just a matter of following a tradition like so many others, that is, those that we can speak of that are natural or cultural. St. Irenaeus reminds us: "*If our flesh is not saved, then the Lord has not redeemed us with his blood, the eucharistic chalice does not make us sharers in his blood, and the bread we break does not make us sharers in his body. There can be no blood without veins, flesh and the rest of the human substance, and this the Word of God actually became: it was with his own blood that he redeemed us.*" (ibid)

What we will we do for our young disciples this weekend is only possible because Jesus Christ, who was with God the Father from the beginning, from before all ages, became like us, truly, in all things save sin; and because of what He actually said and did at the Last Supper, and what He actually underwent and accomplished on the cross by the propitiation of His blood. This is what has been done from the beginning of the Church, and we perpetuate this sacred reality for our sons and daughters in our time. May we continue our good work here at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish; may we continue to uphold the truth of the Faith; may we continue to pray and worship as we have been taught; may we continue to labor in that part of the vineyard assigned us, caring for and nurturing those who are just beginning to grow among us, keeping in mind what Our Lord tells us: "*You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing.*" (Jn 15:3-5) *Father Ralph*


