The assessment is used to cover the cost of Diocesan operations and schools. The formula is based on *all* gross receipts. For our 2021 fiscal year, the annual Cathedratum Assessment is \$89,705. This equates to a weekly payment of \$1,869. This represents an annual increase of \$104.00 from the prior year.

REFLECTION FROM FR. RALPH

After World War I, numerous countries throughout the world joined The League of Nations. By the end of World War II, the United States, Great Britain, the Soviet Union, China and other countries saw a need to establish a representative body to develop and maintain cooperative relationships among nations for the sake of the common good, and consequently, the United Nations became the international entity that it is today, with its charter going into effect on October 24, 1945.

Since then, the United Nations has involved itself in various efforts to bring about justice and peace throughout the world, and though with imperfect results, and even failure in some cases (some would argue more than a few), and along with serious questions in our time regarding issues of favoritism and corruption, it stands as the largest intergovernmental agency in the world with 193 countries in its membership.

Now, we can speak to the United Nations as an example of unity along the lines of what is legislative, civil, social, and economic; but what about the spiritual needs of the millions of people who share a common desire for what is good and just? It is true that we are to strive to improve the quality of the human condition, and we can refer to the teaching of the Church regarding what is known as the "common good." The Catechism of the Church states: "*The dignity of the human person requires the pursuit of the common good. Everyone should be concerned to create and support institutions that improve the conditions of human life. It is the role of the state to defend and promote the common good of civil society. The common good of the whole human family calls for an organization of society on the international level.*" (CCC 1925-1927)

We can see that the United Nations and other such institutions have their proper place when it comes to improving the human condition, and that the dignity of the human person is above all else. Further, the means, the method, and what is actually accomplished does not have priority over the human person, just as the Catechism indicates elsewhere: "*The common good is always oriented towards the progress of persons: 'The order of things must be subordinate to the order of persons, and not the other way around.' This order is founded on truth, built up in justice, and animated by love.*" (CCC 1912) From this we can conclude, according to the teachings of the Church, that there is a higher order of unity that makes all else possible.

When we consider the Gospel for this weekend, recall that Jesus gave authority to the Church to not only teach, forgive sins, preach the resurrection of the dead, as well as provide the sacraments, but also to provide guidance to bring about unity and peace within the church community and the world at large, and, most importantly, unity of faith and prayer. Prayer was integral to Jesus' life and ministry. The Catechism points this out as well: "*Jesus prays before the decisive moments of his mission: before his Father's witness to him during his baptism and Transfiguration, and before his own fulfillment of the Father's plan of love by his Passion. He also prays before the decisive moments involving the mission of his apostles: at his election and call of the Twelve, before Peter's confession of him as "the Christ of God," and again that the faith of the chief of the Apostles may not fail when tempted. Jesus' prayer before the events of salvation that the Father has asked him to fulfill is a humble and trusting commitment of his human will to the loving will of the Father.*" (CCC 2600)

Jesus always prayed before beginning any work regarding his mission, and he always prayed in unity with the Father. So, for us too, as we continue our work in the Church to bring about justice and peace, may we always keep in mind that the unity we strive for is of a higher order than what the world and its institutions may tell us. It begins with unity of faith, according to the truth, according to the teachings of the Church, according to the will of the Father, in unity with the Father, and before anything else, unity in prayer.


