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MARCH SADNESS

If you are a permanent or probationary teacher, you can be laid off if the school board determines that economic circumstances or student enrollment require decreasing the number of employees. If you are a temporary teacher, you may be dismissed at any time prior to serving 75% of the school year (Educ. Code Sec 44954).

Permanent and probationary teachers should:

- Check their membership status (**ONLY SWTA members are entitled to CTA representation**)
- Ensure SWTA has their current contact information

Here is what you should do if you are a permanent or probationary teacher who receives a layoff notice on or before MARCH 15, 2020.

- Confirm your seniority date (not hire date)
- Verified that ALL of your credentials/certifications are on file with Human Resource (Get Copies)

KNOW YOUR CONTRACT

Article 6: Hours Of Employment

(Unit Member On-Site Work Day)

6.2.2 Members of the unit may be required by their immediate supervisor to perform teacher-related duties which include: parent conferences, educational field trips, student guidance assistance, Coordinated Compliance Review, one open house, SST team meetings, and Program Quality Review assignments. The total number of hours assigned to these duties shall be governed by the past practice in the District.

6.2.2.1 The following duties shall be limited to a maximum of fifty-four (54) hours per school year: staff meetings, curriculum development and professional growth.

Helping kids succeed and achieve their dreams

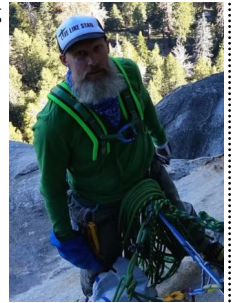
As you rely on each other, uh-huh

"If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together!" This African proverb has been the mantra for SWTA Superstar, Maureen "Mo" McElroy. An adopted child, she grew up in San Fernando Valley along with two brothers and one sister. Mo made the trek to the central coast where she earned a Bachelors in Speech and Hearing Sciences from UC Santa Barbara in 1986. Afterwards, Mo moved down south to pursue graduate work at San Diego State University securing a speech therapist teaching credential and a Masters in Communication. Before a celebratory trip to Europe, SBUSD offered Mo a position. After a three week stay in France, Italy and Greece she began her career in South Bay. A bilingual speech pathologist at Central for 32 years, Mo has lent her expertise to other schools as well. Also, she is Central's IEP and SST chair. This year Mo became SBUSD Diversity Committee Lead. The goal of the committee is to ensure that ALL students, families and staff regardless of their of sexual orientation, gender identity, immigrant status, disabilities, cultural/racial identity and/or religious beliefs feel welcomed and included. The committee has supplied each site with 35 diverse themed books for students and teachers with 2 more books on the way. Due to the committee's effort all SBUSD psychologists received professional development on "Welcoming All Families" (Creating Safe and Inclusive Learning Environments for LGBTQ and Gender Expansive Students). Mo has personally gone to each site and posted the "Welcoming Schools/ Be Who You Are" poster. While at home in Talmadge, Mo spends time with her wife of 29 years, Lena and their dog, "Javier". Also, she maintains contact with her biological parents and siblings. Mo's warm and welcoming spirit makes her a **true SWTA Superstar!**

Mike Moran is an admirable, amazing and athletic SWTA Superstar. He has been a mild /moderate SPED teacher at Bayside since 2006. Mike, a tender yet tough teacher states, **"There is a balance between being able to demonstrate uber ultimate loving and nurturing of children and then still having the honest capacity to be absolutely direct and firm with them as well as their guardians.
