#### **Mosaic Students Capstone Project with Van Buren Center**





Earlier this month, the MOSAIC students completed their Capstone Project at Van Buren.

On their last day at Van Buren, each of them shared how their experience working at the shelter affected them. The students said their perception and understanding of what homelessness is and looks like were challenged and changed after spending time in the shelter. When asked to explain what some of their ideas and beliefs were prior they said it was built around stereotypes and what they saw on tv shows and movies.

For most of the students, it was their first time ever being inside of a shelter. Having the experience helped them learn about the number of services and programs available outside of solely getting a bed to sleep in. The students said seeing the children and faces of the individuals' Van Buren Center serves every day made them realize a homeless crisis can happen to anyone at any time.

The students did an amazing job representing the work the Van Buren Center does and showcasing the work they did while working at the shelter.
