

I-15 Flamingo to Sahara Feasibility Study

The Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) has been making investments in improvements to I-15 over the past three decades. The section of I-15 between Flamingo and Sahara is the last section to be upgraded adjacent to the Las Vegas Strip. This project is a Planning and Environmental Linkages study being used to identify and screen alternatives within a study area to advance the most feasible alternative(s) into future a future National Environmental Policy Act study.



ABOUT THE PROJECT

This project is investigating needed improvements for this important section of I-15, passing through the Resort Corridor, to align capacity needs with recently completed projects such as Project NEON and the I-15 South Design Build. The existing I-15 corridor from Flamingo Road to Sahara Avenue can only accommodate five through lanes in each direction and fails to meet the future traffic demands which will further delay travel through this segment.

NDOT is working to address these deficiencies by evaluating possible improvements and modifications to I-15 in this 4.5-mile segment. This evaluation has consisted of a Feasibility Study which has identified design alternatives that will optimize the operational efficiency and traffic capacity of I-15, as well as its adjacent interchanges with Sahara Avenue, Spring Mountain Road and Flamingo Road.

WHY IS THE PROJECT NEEDED?

The purpose of the proposed project is to:

WHAT IS A FEASIBILITY STUDY?

The I-15 Flamingo to Sahara Feasibility Study is being conducted to help identify proposed improvements and solutions in the study area with input from the public.

The project team has evaluated potential improvements and analyzed their effectiveness against opportunities and constraints in the current corridor, available and needed resources, and costs required. Ultimately, these potential alternatives will be further analyzed in the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process.



What are the proposed improvements?

A timeframe for construction has not been determined at this point in the study process.

NDOT is delivering this project in partnership and collaboration with Federal Highway Administration, RTC of Southern Nevada, Clark County, and the City of Las Vegas.



What is the timeline of the Study?

The study is expected to be complete by the end of 2021.
