



Baltimore Art Deco Bus Tour March 25, 2023





Join Baltimore Decophile Kara Brown in an exploration of Charm City's impressive Art Deco architecture. The first stop on the tour will be the Cathedral of Mary Our Queen, a gorgeous Deco cathedral sure to enthrall. We will be able to explore the cathedral and grounds on our own with self-quided tour information available.

From the cathedral we will head to the renowned Senator Theatre where we will have access to the two beautiful lobbies, and with luck, also the main auditorium if a movie is not playing. The very kind and generous manager will be on hand to answer any questions we might have.

Leaving the Senator we will make our way to downtown Baltimore, passing some less well known Deco buildings en route to lunch at the famous Werner's restaurant.

During the relaxing lunch at Werner's look around at the framed posters to see some of the movies and television shows that have filmed scenes in the perfectly preserved interior. Most recently an adaptation of Baltimore's favorite author, Laura Lippman's, Lady in the Lake.

After lunch we will drive and walk in downtown Baltimore to have a good look at a variety of commercial buildings that still exist today, albeit in various stages of repair.

Baltimore has its own connection to Edgard Sforzina, the brilliant designer who is the subject of ADSW's newly published book of the same name. Mr. Sforzina designed beautiful interiors for the sadly now shuttered Hutzler's department store. It will be the first stop on our walking tour and I hope to coax (shh!) author Jim Linz into sharing what he knows about the project!

The next stop will be the Baltimore War Memorial, a 1925 tribute to Maryland citizens who served in WWI. Known for its beautiful statues of – Mer–horses? Horse–fish? I don't know, but somehow they work... – this will be your chance to see them up close and experience the interior of the Memorial. We will end the day at the former Baltimore Trust Company Building, now a stunning residential community, at 10 Light Street. It is considered by many to be Baltimore's finest Art Deco building.

We will have 1.5 hrs to enjoy the exterior and interior of the building, with several fun surprises in store. It will be a fabulous way to end the day. Think ahead of all the Art Deco mailboxes you have seen, so that you are prepared to weigh in on whether or not this one is the largest!



Deco Auf Deutsch: The Berlin Modernism Housing
Estates (Zoom Event)
Art Deco Society of New York
March 15, 2023



During the 1920s, Germany and France shared a special aesthetic connection, with artists in both countries freely collaborating across the creative spectrum, particularly in the area of modern design. This had a profound effect on housing in the German capital, which after the Greater Berlin Act of 1920 became the third largest municipality in the world. This consolidation resulted in the need for significant urban planning reforms, much of which centered on the creation of new, state–initiated apartments which were intended to not only alleviate overcrowding, but also introduce a better, more hygienic mode of living.

In a true reflection of the period, architectural elements from both the Art Deco and Bauhaus movements were utilized in this city-wide construction project, and the result was a series of seven groundbreaking modernist housing complexes — all distinctly individual in style, and designed by some of the era's most prominent architects, including Bruno Taut, Martin Wagner, Walter Gropius, and Hans Scharoun, among others — which still exist today and together have been named a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

This profusely illustrated presentation will explore not only the history of this unique architectural and social endeavor, but also how its international integration of stylistic methodologies created a lasting testament to the power and impact of modern design.

She is the author of several papers on Art Deco and modernist design, and her graduate thesis, Weimar Rococo: The Cinema Posters of Josef Fenneker in 1920s Berlin, examined how the era's film industry impacted German society and aesthetics, with comparative sections on contemporaneous work in France and the United States.

The music ranges from pop to folk to jazz to electronic to world music styles (Greece, Argentina, Spain).

Deco Auf Deutsch: The Berlin Modernism Housing

During the 1920s, Germany and France shared a special aesthetic connection, with artists in both countries freely collaborating across the creative spectrum, particularly in the area of modern design. This had a profound effect on housing in the German capital, which after the Greater Berlin Act of 1920 became the third largest municipality in the world. This consolidation resulted in the need for significant urban planning reforms, much of which centered on the creation of new, state–initiated apartments which were intended to not only alleviate overcrowding, but also introduce a better, more hygienic mode of living.

In a true reflection of the period, architectural elements from both the Art Deco and Bauhaus movements were utilized in this city-wide construction project, and the result was a series of seven groundbreaking modernist housing complexes — all distinctly individual in style, and designed by some of the era's most prominent architects, including Bruno Taut, Martin Wagner, Walter Gropius, and Hans Scharoun, among others — which still exist today and together have been named a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

This profusely illustrated presentation will explore not only the history of this unique architectural and social endeavor, but also how its international integration of stylistic methodologies created a lasting testament to the power and impact of modern design.

Lauren Miller Walsh is both ADSNY's Executive Director and a design historian with a Master's degree in the History of Design and Curatorial Studies from Cooper Hewitt/Parsons, where she specialized in late 19th—mid–20th–century European and American decorative arts, architecture, and printed material. She is the author of several papers on Art Deco and modernist design, and her graduate thesis, Weimar Rococo: The Cinema Posters of Josef Fenneker in 1920s Berlin, examined how the era's film industry impacted German society and aesthetics, with comparative sections on contemporaneous work in France and the United States.


