PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the International Coalition of Art Deco Societies declared April 28, 2022 as World Art Deco Day, in recognition of the anniversary of the 1925 opening of the International Exhibition of Modern Decorative and Industrial Arts in Paris, from which the style that later became known as "Art Deco" emanated; and

WHEREAS, during the period encompassing the 1920s through the 1940s, the Art Deco aesthetic movement flourished, quickly taking hold around the world and in America, including being celebrated at several U.S. world's fairs in the 1930s; and

WHEREAS, Alexandria, Virginia, boasts some exceptional examples of art deco architecture, as demonstrated today at George Washington Middle School (formerly named George Washington High School) and the 1939 home designed by architect Thomas Parker for portrait photographer Thomas McEvoy, and several more modest yet beautiful examples such as the Monroe Ave. warehouse that is currently home to Swing's Coffee, the warehouses on Leslie Ave., and the Glendale Garden Apartments in the 400 block of E. Glendale Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Art Deco Society of Washington was founded in 1982 to foster awareness, preservation, and appreciation of the Art Deco era's decorative, industrial, architectural, and cultural arts, and has since greatly contributed to the enrichment of the metropolitan D.C. region; and

WHEREAS, the Art Deco Society of Washington has organized a week of activities to celebrate our area's rich Art Deco heritage, the highlight of which will be the Society's 39th annual Washington Modernism Show & Sale to be held here in Alexandria on April 30th and May 1st at the landmark George Washington Masonic National Memorial, a building that itself has many art deco elements inside and out; and

WHEREAS, the Modernism Show will feature an exhibit, Sforzina: Designs for a Modern America 1924-1941, the first retrospective of the work of French architect and interior designer Edgard Sforzina, who emigrated to the U.S. and designed building interiors, fabrics, furniture, lamps, and George Gershwin's Art Deco Riverside Drive apartment, and which will continue at the Memorial through July 9th.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JUSTIN WILSON, Mayor of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, and on behalf of the Alexandria City Council, do hereby proclaim April 24-May 1, 2022 as:

"ART DECO HERITAGE WEEK"

In Alexandria, Virginia. I encourage every community member to learn more about the Art Deco movement, and to appreciate its contributions to architecture, industrial design, and the arts.

SFORZINA:

DESIGNS FOR A MODERN AMERICA

1924-1941



Two years before the opening of the Exposition Internationale des Arts Décoratifs et Industriels Modernes in Paris, often cited as the origin of the Art Deco movement, the roots of French Art Deco were planted in the United States. French architect and interior designer Edgard Sforzina immigrated to the United States in 1923.

In his short but prolific career in America, Sforzina designed George Gershwin's Art Deco Riverside Drive apartment, interiors for parts of Cincinnati Union Terminal, and numerous private residences and store interiors.

Working with Sforzina's granddaughter, Denise Ellison Allen, the Art Deco Society of Washington, catalogued and archived hundreds of original designs and prototypes created by Sforzina and organized the first retrospective of his work. "Sforzina: Designs for a Modern America, 1924-1941" opens April 30th at the

landmark George Washington Masonic National Memorial in Old Town Alexandria. The Exhibition will continue at the Memorial through July 9th.


The Exhibition displays the breadth of Sforzina's work,

- ⇒ As an artist Sforzina created dozens of graphic designs for use on textiles and other products. Examples of his graphic designs include fabric designs created for Cincinnati Union Terminal.
- ⇒ As an artisan Sforzina designed custom furniture, lamps, and other household items. The exhibition displays some of his prototypes.
- ⇒ As an industrial designer Sforzina created designs for individual items such as barware, clocks, lamps, and furniture as well as designs for coordinated groups of furniture including bedroom, living room, and dining room sets. The exhibition includes examples of many of his designs.
- ⇒ As an interior designer, Sforzina created and executed coordinated designs for individual homes and commercial environments. The exhibition identifies many of Sforzina's residential and commercial clients, including period advertisements and reviews.
- ⇒ As an architect, Sforzina created portfolios of designs for modern houses and developed proposals for construction of a new headquarters for the Columbia Broadcasting System and for remodeling the Cloud Club in the Chrysler Building. The exhibition includes examples of Sforzina's architectural designs.

Edgard Desiré Sforzina was born and raised in Paris, graduating from L'École des Arts Décoratifs about 1901. Following his graduation, Sforzina worked as a designer for Carthian & Beaumetz, primarily for the famed Art dealer Joseph Duveen of London.

Sforzina's career was interrupted by military service during World War I. Following the war he joined the Parisian firm Lucien Alavoine & Company, one of the world's leading interior design firms. Alavoine subsequently assigned Sforzina to its Fifth Avenue office in New York City. He arrived in New York November 17, 1922. Sforzina briefly returned to Paris to bring his wife and infant daughter to their new home in America.

Sforzina initially continued his work for Alavoine, but in 1928 established his own design firm, dropping the "S" from his name to form Forzina, Inc. He was also employed by the architectural firm Fellheimer & Wagner to work on the interior design of Cincinnati Union Terminal.



Among work commissioned in New York was Fashion entrepreneur Hattie Carnegie's shop and personal residences for architect Alfred Fellheimer, the wife of industrialist and philanthropist F. Lewisohn, and composer George Gershwin.

Although Sforzina's roots were firmly planted in Manhattan, commercial projects soon sprouted in such cities as Boston, Baltimore, Chicago, and Cincinnati. Sforzina designed

- Slattery's Millinery shop, described in a 1928 advertisement as Boston's first salon in "L'art Moderne"
- The "Salon Moderne" in Hutzler Brothers department store in Baltimore, opened in 1928.
- A ticket booth in an unidentified building in Chicago.
- The Executive offices in Cincinnati Union Terminal.



Sforzina was among the designers featured in a 1929 exhibition of the new modernistic style held at the American Designers Gallery in New York. Author Mary Fenton Roberts noted that

"In the main room... there was a fine display of decorative fittings for use in a Modernistic room. And these included ... table silverware by Ilonka Karasz, photographs by Steichen, furniture by Edgard S. Forzina [sic] as well as Paul T. Frankl, and many other things that would be essential in the home of anyone wishing a Modernistic interior." Arts & Decoration, February 1929


The Sforzina exhibition also shows some of the innovations incorporated into Sforzina's designs, among which were use of washable fabric covered walls, upholstery fabrics containing rayon, concealed overhead lighting, extensive use of decorative metal trim, and improvements in store design such as directional flooring.

The exhibition banners are displayed in the Grand Masonic Hall.
