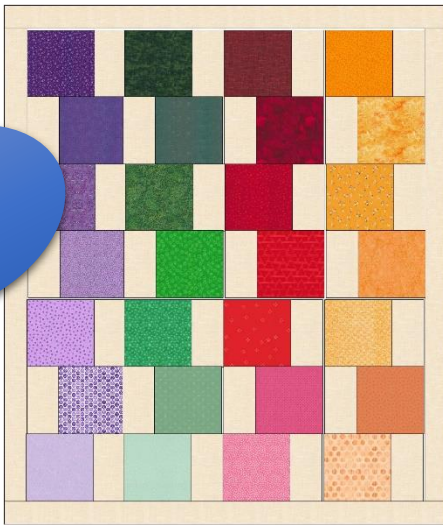




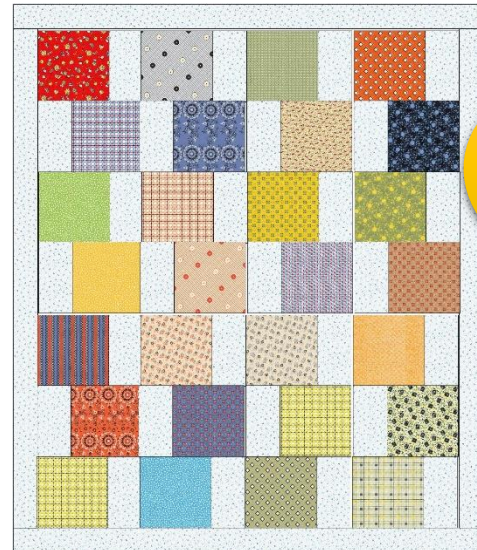

## Color Columns

Finished Size: approx. 62.5 x 73

Scrappy Version

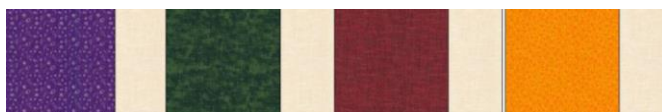
- There are only 2 blocks in this quilt:
  - One is a 9½” finished block
  - One is a 4½” x 9½” finished block

### FABRIC NEEDED FOR QUILT TOP:

- For the **FOUR-COLOR** Version:
  - Seven (7) 10” squares of different shades of **COLOR ONE** (dark to light)
  - Seven (7) 10” squares of different shades of **COLOR TWO** (dark to light)
  - Seven (7) 10” squares of different shades of **COLOR THREE** (dark to light)
  - Seven (7) 10” squares of different shades of **COLOR FOUR** (dark to light)
  - Twenty-Eight (28) 5” x 10” rectangles of background fabric (or fourteen (14) 10” squares – cut in half)
  - 7 – 3” strips = BORDERS
  - 8 – 2½” strips = Binding
- For the **SCRAPPY** Version:
  - Twenty-Eight (28) 10” squares of different fabrics
  - Twenty-Eight (28) 5” x 10” rectangles of background fabric (or fourteen (14) 10” squares – cut in half)
  - 7 – 3” strips = BORDERS
  - 8 – 2½” strips = Binding
- Assemble the blocks
  - Sew a 5” x 10” rectangle of background fabric to a 10” square
  - Each block should be 14” including seam allowances
  - Trim / Square up each block

### First Row:

- Layout the first row of 4 blocks. Turn the blocks as shown in the diagram on the right
- You need four (4) First Rows



### Second Row:

- Rotate each block 90 degrees and layout the second row of 4 blocks. Turning the blocks as shown in the diagram on the right
- You need three (3) Second Rows



- Continue the above the process until you have seven (7) rows.
  - Four (4) First Rows and Three (3) Second Rows.
- As you assemble your rows, press the seams to the left on the odd rows and to the right on the even rows.
- Sew the completed rows together.
- For the border, sew strips together and sew strips to the top and bottom and then to the left and right sides.
- For the binding, sew strips together, fold the strip in half and press.

All patterns for Snuggled in Hope are just ideas. You can make them your own designs. We ask that you make the finished top at least 55" x 65" and no bigger than 65" x 75". You can add borders to reach the needed size. Remember all the borders don't have to be the same size or even on all four sides. Quilt tops will lose about 3% of their size once they are quilted and washed. Each quilt going to camp is washed before delivered. There are absolutely no quilt police! Please be creative These quilts are for kids who will love them no matter what.

**NOTE:** If you picked up one of the already prepared kits, please know we did our best to see that everything was correct. However, we may have missed something. You may substitute something you have on hand or simply return the kit for a new one.

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
