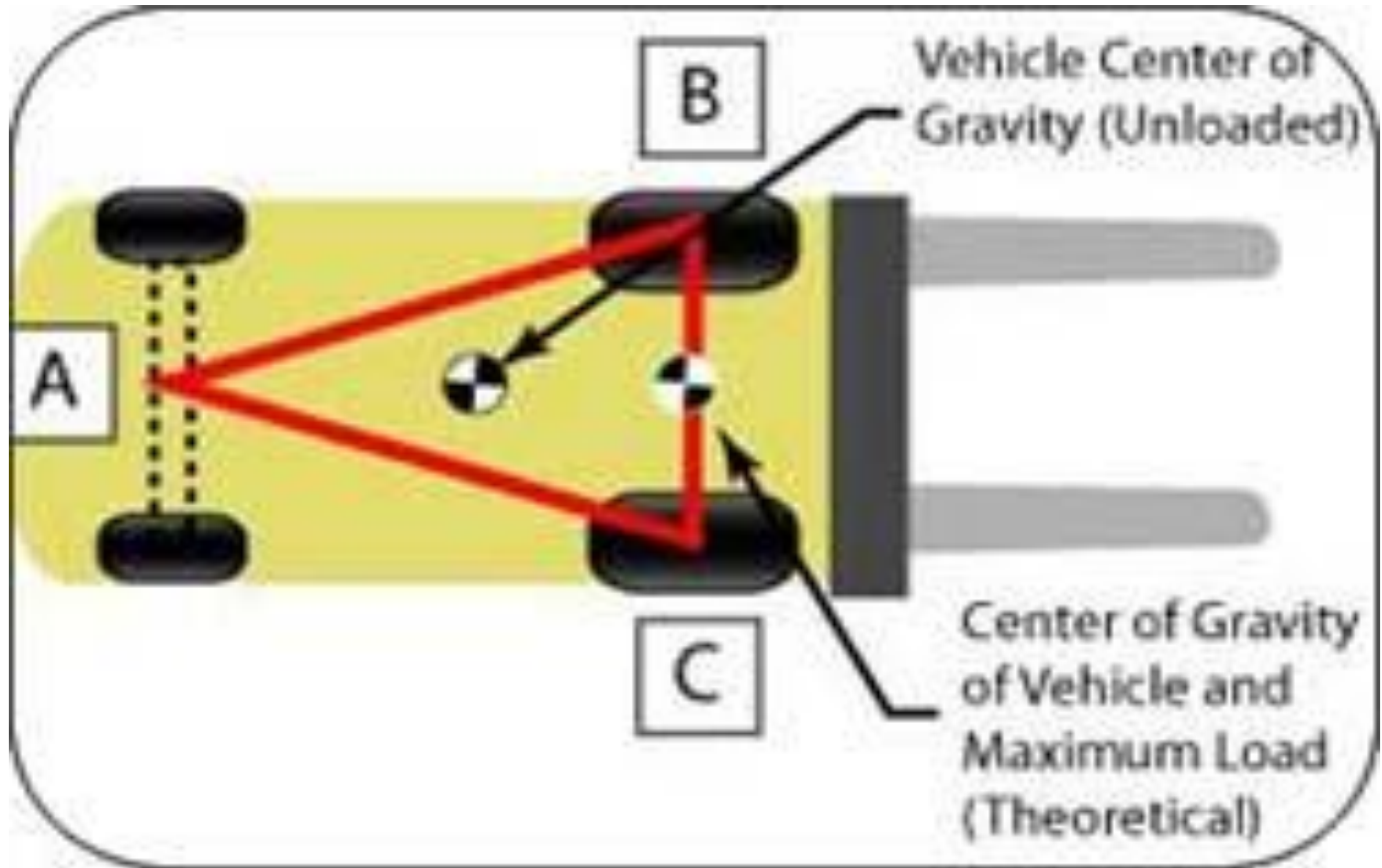

Operational Safety Checklist

- Operate at appropriate speeds.
- Slow down when turning and at intersections.
- Maintain three truck length following distance.
- No horseplay.
- Seat belts should be worn at all times.
- Keep arms and legs inside the forklift.
- Keep workers clear of suspended loads.
- Never drive towards a worker.
- Do not carry passengers.
- Yield to pedestrians.
