




Tracking Cable's Investment in Infrastructure

Tracking Cable's Top Internet Speeds



NUMBER OF FAMILIES CONNECTED TO THE INTERNET THROUGH CABLE'S BROADBAND ADOPTION PROGRAMS



Political Landscape



U.S. Senate **+6 Republicans**

- 2018 changes: AZ (Sinema-D), FL (Scott-R), IN (Braun-R), MO (Hawley-R), ND (Cramer-R), NV (Rosen-D)
- 116th Congress:
 - **53 Republicans** / **47 Democrats**
 - 76 men & 24 women – **most women in U.S. history**
 - 2 Asian / 2 African-American / 4 Hispanic / 2 LGBTQ


U.S. House of Representatives **+38 Democrats**

- 2018: Democrats gained majority; won at least 40 U.S. House seats
- 116th Congress: **235 Democrats** / **197 Republicans** / 3 vacant
- California Leadership: Speaker Nancy Pelosi / Minority Leader Kevin McCarthy

Governors **+4 Republicans**

- 36 governors were up for election last year; post 2018 election: **27 Republicans** / **23 Democrats**
- 2018 Democratic Pick-Ups (7): IL, KS, ME, MI, NV, NM & WI





IL Constitutional Offices +Democrats

- Democrats swept all statewide offices – **first time since 2006**
- Governor: Pritzker (D) 53% defeated incumbent Rauner (R) 39%
- AG: Raoul (D) 54% defeated Harold (R) 43%

IL Congressional Delegation +8 Democrats

- Post 2018 election: **13 Democrats / 5 Republicans**
- 6th District: Casten (D) 54% defeated incumbent Roskam (R) 46%
- 14th District: Underwood (D) 53% defeated incumbent Hultgren (R) 48%

IL State Senate +21 Democrats


- 101st General Assembly: **40 Democrats (veto-proof majority) / 19 Republicans**
- Ties 2012 election for **greatest number of Democratic Senators**
- 20 women senators – **most in Illinois history**

IL House of Representatives +30 Democrats

- 101st General Assembly: **74 Democrats (veto-proof majority) / 44 Republicans**
- **Most Democratic House members** since Speaker Madigan assumed control in 1982

IN Constitutional Offices +Republicans

- Republicans hold all statewide offices – including both U.S. Senators Young & Braun
- 2018: Braun (R) defeated incumbent U.S. Sen. Donnelly (D)
- Current Governor Holcomb was Lt. Governor under Mike Pence

IN Congressional Delegation +5 Republicans

- Post 2018 election: **7 Republicans** / **2 Democrats**
- No change in party counts from 2016 to 2018 elections

IN State Senate +30 Republicans

- 121st General Assembly: **40 Republicans** / **10 Democrats**
- Post 2018 election: Democrats gained 1 seat

IN House of Representatives +34 Republicans

- 121st General Assembly: **67 Republicans** / **33 Democrats**
- Post 2018 election: Democrats gained 3 seats



INDIANA



MI Constitutional Offices **+Democrats**

- Democrats hold all statewide offices – including both U.S. Senators Stabenow & Peters
- 2018 Gubernatorial election:
 - open seat; incumbent Governor Snyder (R) was term-limited
 - former Minority Leader Whitmer (D) defeated former AG Schuette (R)

MI Congressional Delegation **even**

- Post 2018 election: **7 Democrats** / **7 Republicans**
- Democrats gained 3 seats to even the count

MI State Senate **+6 Republicans**

- 99th Legislature: **22 Republicans** / **16 Democrats**
- Post 2018 election: Republicans lost supermajority

MI House of Representatives **+6 Republicans**

- 99th Legislature: **58 Republicans** / **52 Democrats**
- Post 2018 election: Democrats gained 5 seats
