GOD IS OUR REFUGE

Psalm 46:1-3 (NKJV) says, ***“God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in (a time of) trouble. Therefore, we will not fear even though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea; though its waters roar and be troubled, though the mountains shake with its swelling.”*** God often judges the nations, even His own, when they have turned away from Him.
