Many Christians quote Jeremiah 29:11 in the KJV which says, *"For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the LORD, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end."* The New English Version says, *"For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope."* It uses the word "plans" instead of instead of the "thoughts." The Amplified version says also uses the word "plans."
