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BE A GIANT KILLER

There comes a time when we have to say enough is enough.

Do you remember the story of David and Goliath? You will find it in 1 Samuel chapter 17. I can see young David as he approached his brothers with “lunch.” If you remember the story, he had been anointed by Samuel to be the next King, but nothing had taken place. It wasn’t the right time. His father sent him from Dothan down to the battle to take lunch to his brothers.

When he got there, he saw an army led by a King Saul paralyzed with fear because he had lost his anointing and now faced a giant.
